

It is tempting, as part of the autumn/early winter tidy up to go forth with gusto (and a pair of sharp secateurs), to remove many of the dead flowers and old stems from our garden perennials. Completing this task certainly gives a feeling of satisfaction at a job well done. However, leaving some plants uncut may give valuable overwintering places for garden fauna, and can also provide some interesting structural features in a winter garden landscape. Leaving some old vegetation can also protect new tender buds (e.g. leaving old *Hydrangea* flowers over the winter). It may also be the wrong time of year to cut back some plants such as *Clematis* — so do check beforehand in your gardening books.

Deciduous overwintering grasses are excellent features to shelter insects, and their fountains of plumes look good too. After you have enjoyed their appearance through the winter, they can then be cut back in late winter or early spring. Attractive winter outlines are provided by the old flowerheads of plants such as *Rudbeckia*, *Allium*, *Agapanthus* and many others. The starry bracts of umbelliferous plants (members of the carrot family) are particularly attractive in this respect along with teasels which finches love for the seeds.

If you have a lot of ivy that has got out of hand and needs tidying up, if you can, then wait until the end of this month, when it should have finished flowering. Bees and other insects will certainly thank you for that as they make full use of the flowers as a late nectar source.

Similarly if you have berry bearing hedges, then it will help until birds have taken a good share of the crop, before carrying out hedge-trimming. Leaving hips on garden roses will give similar benefits, but you will need to decide whether this will cause too much winter wind-rock (roses generally have shallow roots, so plants are prone to being dislodged by winter winds).

It is worth remembering that autumn/winter cutting of Leyland cypress hedges can make them susceptible to the development of brown patches.

Dear All

This month's letter was inspired by some accidental eavesdropping. I say accidental, because I wasn't trying to listen, but people on trains do seem these days to be ready to let the whole carriage hear their conversation, especially when they're on the phone. A while back I was in a train where we were all treated to a very loud business discussion, at the end of which the man boomed into his phone 'Of course, this is all completely confidential'...

Anyway, the conversation I unintentionally overheard recently was someone who had evidently just been diagnosed with a serious illness, discussing with a friend the reactions she was getting from the people she told, and how everyone was telling her how well she was going to cope, and how wonderful life was going to be, and she felt bad that it didn't seem to be cheering her up much. The temptation to join in the conversation was huge — a bit difficult, as she was sitting somewhere behind me, so I wasn't even sure who was speaking — but I felt like standing up and shouting 'let yourself grieve!'

Let yourself grieve. It\s something we're not always very good at doing. We're getting a bit better at grieving a death, particularly of a family member, as shown by the growing popularity of the All Souls' and Remembrance services. Even then, tho', we often think our grieving should be over fairly quickly, with 'normal life' resuming after just a few weeks. But that's just not realistic. I don't really want to see everyone going around in black or grey, times have changed too much, but actually that old-fashioned habit of going into mourning, and letting everyone know that you were stlll needing space to grieve, wasn't all bad, and the timescale was pretty realistic – you were expected to be in mourning for a year for a parent, up to two for a partner.

But grieving isn't only about death. When we have a major change in our life circumstances, including – perhaps especially – our health, we need to grieve the loss of what is gone. We can learn to cope with long-tem health conditions – of course we can. We can keep going, learn to do things differently, get used to taking tablets, doing exercises, giving ourselves injections – life can still be very good. But we must have the chance to grieve for the loss of the life we knew, the old way of doing things, because it's only when we grieve the loss and accept the change in our lives that we can move on to coping and being positive and discovering the riches of the new way of life we've been forced to develop.

<u>Clerk's notes of Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Parish Council on Monday 7th October 2013</u> at Braceborough Village Hall

The clerk reported that she had informed SKDC that Paul Morriss from Braceborough had been co-opted onto the Parish Council in place of Pete Milne. It is understood that Anglianwater had submitted a planning application for a pumping station at Wilsthorpe to Lincolnshire County Council. Cllrs Susan Burgoin and James Shorrock arranged for residents of Wilsthorpe to view the plans at the Church. Cllr Burgoin reported that 23 people attended, with the majority happy with the final outcome.

It is understood that Ashton Estates will be concentrating on trying to resolve the flooding problems at Quincey's Lane in the very near future. Once that has been completed they will then move to the Cocked Hat Junction.

Grant Thornton had concluded the external audit and it is in accordance with proper accounting practice. The information has been placed on the parish website:-http://parishes.lincolnshire.gov.uk/BraceboroughandWilsthorpe. The Parish Council also agreed that the Village Hall Defibrillator fund should be supported but more information was required before a grant was given.

The following planning applications had been approved:— Braceborough -lvy Lodge, lvy Farmhouse, Manor Farm. Wilsthorpe — Glenside. The Parish Council agreed to no objection to the felling of 3 Hawthorn bushes at the Village Hall.

Potholes were again an issue along the Wilsthorpe to Braceborough road.

Cllr Kentish reported that the questionnaire for the Parish Plan/Development Statement had been to the Steering Group. It was agreed that the Parish Council would hold a prize draw and that there would be a central collection point for the return of the forms in each village.

D.Cllr Miss Channell asked if 'Dog Fouling' notices were required.

C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that The Boundary Commission would be doing a full review of Lincolnshire County Council and it is expected that the number of councillors will be reduced. He said that the 'Big Society Fund' is once again in operation, if any organisation would like to apply please contact him direct. The Government is looking at reducing its grant to local authorities which could have serious effect on services. Finally, the Library consultation finished at the end of September.
