There are two categories – villages with populations between 100 and 500; and those with populations between 500 and 5,000. There are prizes of £400, £300 and £200 for the top three in each category, along with commemorative certificates and even a gold litter bin for the top aard winners.

All villages will be automatically assessed throughout July, with help from the Lincolnshire Gardens Trust, looking at village facilities, grounds maintenance and street scene, front gardens and evidence of community pride.

This competition sees communities working together with a common goal and I would urge you to help spread the word among your residents and encourage them to play their part.

On a similar theme we are also looking to celebrate those individuals, groups and organisations who really go above and beyond to help others, with the launch of the SK Community Awards.

This is a terrific opportunity to ensure those selfless people – and every community has them - are given the recognition they deserve.

Nominations can be made right up until July 18 and the winners will be announced in September. All those nominated will receive a certificate marking their efforts, and the winners will also receive commemorative plaques.

We want to celebrate the wonderful work of our community champions and, again I would urge you to nominate those who give up so much of their own time to help others and who make a real difference in your community.
