

A LETTER FROM FR ARAN CONCERNING LEAD THEFTS FROM OUR CHURCHES AND HOW THE COMMUNITY CAN HELP

Following incidents of lead being stolen from two of our own churches St Lawrence in Tallington and St Margaret's in Braceborough, could I please especially urge villagers to be vigilant and report anything suspicious to the police. Part of a statement from Lincolnshire Police is written below.

'We are appealing for communities to report suspicious activity at churches following a series of lead thefts. Over the last ten weeks, 16 churches have reported thefts. These occurred in Braceborough, Tallington, Swinstead, Navenby, Eagle, North Scarle, Haconby, Stoke Rochford, Skillington, North Witham and Hough on the Hill. Our close neighbours in Cambridgeshire: the churches of Wansford, Elton, Yarwell, Castor and Ailsworth have also been victims of lead theft.

This type of theft can cost churches tens of thousands of pounds and can mean that rainwater gets into a church and damages the interior. The force is asking for the support of local residents and especially people who live close enough to be able to see their church. The message from officers is to please report any suspicious activity and if you notice unusual vehicles or behaviour in the vicinity of a church call **101 quoting 'Operation Brompton 2'**.

Descriptions and vehicle registration numbers are particularly helpful, but you are advised to never put yourself at any risk. Sally Picker from Lincolnshire Police's Crime Prevention Team, adds: "Sometimes it is difficult to see that lead is missing and unfortunately some churches only notice when it has rained. "There are however some key things to look out for and residents can play a big part in helping us prevent these crimes. "If you do live near a church and hear dull thudding noises, it could be lead being dropped from the church roof. Another giveaway that lead has been stripped from a roof is if you see divots in the grass around a church or on gravel pathways. If you spot either of these signs, please call us on 101 immediately. Obtaining a roof alarm for the church is undoubtedly the biggest single deterrent to prevent lead theft and the cost of these is something churches may well have to fund raise for'.

I especially remember in my prayers the community of Braceborough, following the theft of lead from St Margaret's church and for all people that fall victims of, and deal with, the consequences of these crimes of theft from church buildings.

Family Fruit Cake (Makes 2 & freezes well)

This recipe is one of my good old "stand-by's that I have been using for years. I find it is an invaluable addition to a picnic meal, and we wouln't dream of leaving home without this cake for a self-catering holiday. Given the opportunity, it will keep two to three weeks in an airtight tin!

Ingredients:

1 ¼ lbs Mixed dried fruit

- 8 ozs granulated sugar
- 8 ozs margarine
- ½ pt water
- 2 Beaten Eggs
- 1 lb SR Flour

<u>Method</u>

Place the first four ingredients into a pan and simmer for 20 - 25 minutes, then cool.

To microwave

Place in a large bowl. Cook on 'high' for 5 mins, stir and cook on 'high' for 8 mins longer, then cool.

Stir in the beaten eggs and then the flour. Transfer the mixture to 2 greased and lined 7" loose-bottom tins and bake at 150C, 300F, Gas Mark 2 for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

Dave Kentish, Barry Odell, Paul Morriss, James Shorrock & Susan Burgoin continue to be your representatives on the Parish Council for another four years. At the AGM of the Council Cllr Kentish was re-elected as Chairman with Cllr Morriss as Vice-Chairman and the end of year accounts were approved. At the Parish Meeting D.Cllr Dobson congratulated all Parish Councillors on being re-elected. It was agreed not to progress with bat boxes but to concentrate on swift/blue tit boxes and for more remote areas owl boxes, on advice from a wildlife expert.

Councillors objected to the erection of a two-storey extension at 1 Waterworks Cottage, Wilsthorpe due to its overpowering nature. Councillors had no objection to the conversion of existing storage building to dwelling at Beehive Cottage but did have concerns about access. Erection of new dwelling at plot east of The Old Rectory was refused.

It was agreed to award the mowing contract of the verges within the parish from 1^{st} April to 31^{st} October to Mr. Harris.

Councillors would like resident's to give their views on the suggestion that the street lights belonging to the District Council be switched off completely, or only in certain areas of the parish, or from midnight to 6am, or leave alone. The idea is that the two villages would lead the way in helping the environment by getting rid of light pollution. Please respond with your thoughts to the Clerk before 14th June 2019.



LETTER FROM Fr ARAN

'Can you give me five'?

It's still Easter - we're over halfway through the great 50 day season of Easter.

It would be really easy to stop reading now because for many the fun of Easter is over, the Bank Holidays have passed, and The Scarecrow Festival was enjoyed by many (just one of the several community events in the seven villages in the Uffington Group). I've enjoyed all of the commemorations, celebrations and events so far; from washing some of your feet using the spa water from Braceborough Spa to riding around on a scooter judging the scarecrows.

Easter ends with Pentecost on the 9th June. Whitsun is the traditional name given to this Principle Feast. Like all significant occasions, there is a time of planning and this starts nine days earlier with the Ascension on 30th May. Please join us at St Andrew's Church West Deeping for our Ascension service at 7pm if you are able to, but there are other ways to join in.

Now the big deal about Easter is you and those you care about!

A big part of what I do is to pray for you and our community. At Ascension we focus our prayer and join with the Church of England and pray for specific people until Pentecost on the 9 th June. For those new to praying, nine days is brilliant. You could even tell me the reason why you want me to pray for each person. Get the list of five names to me however you want. E-Mail might be the fastest or leave them on one of the Altars in Church, and I'll pick them up. At our services for Ascension and Pentecost, I will be praying for all of you, and I will also privately pray for all those names you have sent me. I might have bitten off more than I can chew, but I doubt I'll be sent 11,000 names (based on five names per resident in the seven villages).

I'm excited about how many names I'll get...
