



WILDLIFE & GARDENING IN NOVEMBER

From now until the end of December - when deciduous plants have lost their leaves - is the time to take hardwood cuttings. This is a very effective way to propagate most deciduous shrubs (e.g. dogwood, forsythia, buddleia, fig, rose), trees (e.g. plane, willow) many climbers (e.g. honeysuckle, Virginia creeper) and some evergreens (e.g. holly).

For taking cuttings use healthy stems that have been growing during the year. Remove the top soft part of the stem and discard. Cuttings can be taken from the remainder of the stem and should be about 15 to 30 centimetres long, and the thickness of a pencil. Make a sloping cut immediately above the bud at the top of your cutting. This should slope away from the bud, so that it sheds water away. At the lower end of the cutting, make a clean straight cut below a bud. This difference in cuts also has the benefit of showing which is the top and bottom of your cutting.

Dip the lower end of the cutting into hormone rooting powder. This encourages the formation of roots and should prevent fungal infection. Cuttings should be planted to about two thirds of their length into a trench into which has been dug garden compost or other organic material. You can now forget about your cuttings until springtime, when they should have rooted. Although rooting of hardwood cuttings is a relatively slow process it is usually successful. Rooted cuttings can be potted on during the summer, for growing on and eventual planting out.

In especially cold winters, cuttings are best planted into the ground in a cold frame, or in pots or trays in an unheated greenhouse. **Tim and Donna**

Dear All

When I was a university chaplain, before moving to Uffington, I had a German Lutheran colleague - a succession of them, in fact, generally spending a year seconded to us by the Bavarian Lutheran church. It was a great experience, and we learnt a lot, not only about one another but about ourselves, as we thought about things we'd always taken for granted. One Lutheran found it increasingly hard, during her year, to cope with the Church of England's membership criteria - specifically, the lack of them. She was used to a church with a definite list of members, committed to at least some degree - and all paying church tax. I remember her complaining piteously that the Church of England had such fuzzy edges, she couldn't tell who was in and who was out. It made me realise that it's one of the things I value tremendously about the good old CofE - all that you need for membership is baptism, and other than that there's no list of rules, nothing to sign, no test to pass. In fact, it's even wider than that, because while membership requires baptism, anyone, baptised or not, can come to church, and call upon the services of the clergy - we don't ask to see a certificate before taking a funeral, talking through a problem, or blessing a child, a home or a marriage. There are no strict boundaries.

It was after Sabine's comment that I renamed my 'Exploring Faith' group 'The Church with fuzzy edges', I liked the image so much. Not everyone is comfortable with fuzzy edges, though, and it seems that part of the problem behind the constantly recurring headlines about splits in the Anglican Communion is a desire by some people to define precisely who is in and who is out. Those making the definitions, of course, are in – gay bishops, it would seem, are very much out, as are those with more liberal views on a number of issues.

The question I keep coming back to is - what does God want from the church? Because surely the church has to be about trying to fulfill God's wishes, not our own. I had the same problem over the ordination of women - still not accepted throughout the Anglican communion, or even throughout the Church of England - if God doesn't want women priests, why do so many women feel called to serve as priests, and why when the church tests those callings does it accept them as true? And if God is calling women to serve, how can we refuse to let it happen?

It can be very easy to look around us and judge other people's commitment, and wonder how on earth they can count themselves as Christians. Sometimes we can be too easy on ourselves - and sometimes we judge ourselves harshly, too. But God calls all of us into the body of Christ, and doesn't always seem as picky as we might be about who is called into full-time ministry, either.

So I'll vote to keep the fuzzy edges, let as many people as possible be part of the church - and keep praying hard, to try to find out what God is asking us to do - God who has promised to send the Spirit to lead us into all truth, God whose church it actually is.






