Dear Friends,

We're starting this month with a celebration. Over the last 18 months, churchgoers from our parishes and from Stamford have been taking part in a lay ministry training course, and on the 3rd February the first course members will be formally authorised for their ministry in this group of parishes – indeed, this deanery, because the idea is that all the lay ministers can help out anywhere in the Stamford Deanery.

The service is going to be at All Saints' in Stamford, at 6.30pm, and the Archdeacon of Lincoln will be preaching; three people from our congregations are to be authorised, Les Baillie and Donna and Geoff Radley; and there will be no evensong at Barholm that day, so that we can all go to All Saints to support them and the others being authorised.

In this group, our lay ministers will be running the new youth group, leading worship, and visiting, among other things. Lay ministers do a one year Parish Foundation Course, then modules, long and short, in areas they're interested in – like worship, visiting, working with children and young people, older people, those who have been bereaved, and plenty more options besides. You can develop skills you already have, or explore new ones; start something new in the parish, carry on with what's already there, or think about faith and work. There is a new Foundation Course planned for later this year – do contact me (or Martin Brebner) if you're interested.

Important as authorised lay ministry is, tho', especially in a group like ours, there are many things to do that don't require taking a course, and we're always in need of volunteers – to look after people, to look after the buildings and the churchyards, to help keep the church running.

It's becoming increasingly difficult to find people to take on jobs in the church – and I know we're not alone, plenty of other organisations and charities are finding the same thing. People feel more and more stretched at work and at home with all the pressures of life, so taking on yet more responsibility isn't very attractive.

Without people to do things, though, the whole system breaks down. I can only dash around the countryside taking several services on a Sunday because someone else has arrived in time to get the building open and everything set up; I have more than enough paperwork to do without trying to do the accounts for seven churches; and I can't really chair meetings *and* take the minutes (besides, I'm really bad at it).

Rector's letter continued:

There are, luckily, still people who are taking on the jobs of being churchwarden, treasurer and secretary – but in this group, with seven churches, we need 14 churchwardens, 7 treasurers and 7 secretaries, and we don't have nearly that many. So if you think that you could take on any of those jobs, do come and talk to me, to find out what it involves. Churchwardens need to come to church, of course – but it's not unknown for someone to become churchwarden first, then start coming to the services more regularly! And treasurers don't necessarily come to all the services, or secretaries either.

If those jobs still seem like too much for you at the moment, there are plenty of smaller jobs, from reading the lesson to giving out the books to arranging flowers, washing linen or polishing pews, weeding neglected graves or trying to control the churchyard ivy. And of course, we do all of these things to keep the churches open so that anyone can come to worship God, in the services or dropping into a peaceful church during the week – so if you're dashing round too much to be able to volunteer, why not come and enjoy some peace – join us for a service on a Sunday, or just come and share the space and beauty of our buildings or the peace of the churchyards and take time to be with God.

Uffington Parish Council. Report from Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday, 9th January, 2013. The Tallington Crossing in in the Planning Stage but a definite decision must be made before March 2014 to guarantee funding. Highways have been informed regarding various points i.e. Pot Holes in and around the Village, flooding on Newstead Corner, Verge erosion on Newstead Lane and Essendine Road. Since the meeting the Clerk has been informed that highway work will take place on Newstead Lane, date to be confirmed. A copy of this area's salting routes has been put on the Uffington Web site by Mr. Irvine. The Clerk had contacted the Environment Agency regarding the water damage to Uffington River Bridge, Agency staff had been seen at the bridge but nothing as yet has been reported. PCSO Michelle Laughton reported that she had spoken to the workmen at 1 Main Road regarding the state of the verge outside the property. They stated that it would be reinstated when the work was finished, she would monitor the situation. Cllr. Mulvaney stated that permission had been given by the owners of the Bertie Arms for parents to park in the car park as the parents were trying to organise a "walking bus" to school. District Councillor K. Cooke reported that a District Council working group had conducted a review of the boundaries and they proposed a reduction of three Councillors. This proposal had been reported to the Independent Commission who will review their submission. It is most likely that the Truesdale Ward (our Ward) will be split into two as the current government would like to see single seat wards. Date of next meeting Wednesday, 20th February, 2013 at 8pm.

WILDLIFE GARDENING IN FEBRUARY

You may have received a bird nest box for Christmas and are wondering where would be the best and safest place for it in the garden. The answer largely depends on the type of box and what bird species it is hoped will nest in it. Although nest boxes are best put up in the autumn as birds will look around during the autumn and winter months for roosting or feeding, they may use the same boxes for nesting the following spring. However, many birds will start nesting from February (depending on the weather). In general, try to place the box so birds have a clear flight path to the nest, and tilt it forward slightly to prevent driving rain from entering. Unless there are trees or buildings to provide shade during the day, face the box between north and east, so as to avoid strong sunlight (and summer heat) and the wettest winds (usually from the west). It is also important to site the box away from any bird feeding stations (bird tables etc). Boxes for tits, sparrows or starlings should be fixed two to four metres up a tree or a wall. House sparrows and starlings like nestboxes placed high up under the eaves. Since these birds nest in loose colonies, two or three can be sited spaced out on the same side of the house, or use a communal nesting box with several compartments and separate entrance holes. But keep these away from areas where house martins normally nest. Openfronted boxes for robins and wrens need to be below 2m, well hidden in vegetation. Those for spotted flycatchers 2-4m high, sheltered by vegetation, and woodpecker boxes should be 3-5m high on a tree trunk and away from disturbance. Fixing your nestbox with nails may damage the tree so it is better to attach it either with a nylon bolt or with wire around the trunk or branch. Use a piece of hose or section of car tyre around the wire to prevent damage to the tree. The fixing should be checked every couple of years as the tree grows in girth as well as height. The RSPB provides lots more information about types of nest boxes, and their siting and cleaning – see www.rspb.org.uk/advice/helpingbirds Donna and Tim

DON'T JUST GIVE UP - TAKE UP SOMETHING FOR LENT

Easter is early this year, falling on the 31st March. Full details of services and events for Holy Week and Easter will be in next month's magazine, but Lent is almost upon us already. Shrove Tuesday is on the 12th February, so you'd better start thinking about pancakes soon, then Lent starts with Ash Wednesday on the 13th.
