

#### **BISHOPS LETTER - MAY 2012**

Dear Friends,

The Feast of the Pentecost falls at the end of May.

The idea of the Holy Spirit coming upon us as it came upon and overwhelmed the apostles in the upper room at the first Pentecost, is a powerful image for a Christian. However, the Holy Spirit's impact might also be rather less dramatic. The Spirit of God, who brooded over the waters of creation, who inspired the prophets, who entered the womb of Mary and descended upon Jesus at his baptism — is active in God's world and can come to us in simpler and more mundane ways.

Having discerned the presence of the Spirit, we need to nurture that presence. God gives human beings a part in creation, redemption and sanctification of the world – not the primary part, that's for him; but we are called to co-operate in discerning and nurturing that which speaks of him to our world. We can do this in a variety of ways: for example by seeking to protect the integrity of creation, or by working to bring reconciliation and harmony between ethnic and religious groups and always by blowing on the embers of the spirit of God in our own life. These embers are there in every human being and are always ready gently to be fanned into a bigger flame.

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire!

#### Dear All

This month's letter is a bit different. The sermon I preached the week after Easter seemed to strike a chord with people; I had a strong response, and suggestions that it should be put into the magazine – so here it is. It's only lightly adapted, so just imagine it in the middle of a service, rather than written as a letter.

Have you ever noticed how much of the Resurrection story is about failure? Judas is the great betrayer, but <u>all</u> the characters in the gospel story fail in one way or another. Peter denies knowing Jesus; he and the others are unable to stay awake with Christ; the disciples run away in fear; they are unable to believe the story of the Resurrection; they don't recognise the risen Christ even when he is there with them. Again and again, even the people who were closest to the events at the heart of the gospel, the ones who were there, failed to trust God, failed to believe in Christ.

It's not only the original disciples who share that frailty. We all, if we're honest, have our doubts from time to time, all fail to believe that God really keeps his promises. We run away, too, or I know I do - there are times when I really don't want to pray, when I say the services and leave it at that, because I simply do not want to have a one-to-one conversation with God - he might say something I don't want to hear, and it's much safer to run away than to talk.

The problem then is that we begin to cut ourselves off from God. We're afraid of what we've done or haven't done, we start to feel uncomfortable or guilty - you should hear the number of times people I don't know start explaining to me just why they haven't been to church lately, because their conscience pricks them when they see the collar - and sometimes we even decide we have no right to come to God. These days there aren't too many people who say that they can't take communion because they're not good enough Christians - but there are quite a few who won't join a church or start confirmation classes because you already have to be a good person and a committed Christian for that, don't you - and if you think about it, that's not so very different from saying you're not good enough to take communion.

By most reckoning, the first disciples weren't terribly good Christians, either. But the stories we hear at this time of year, the stories about what happened after Easter morning, can encourage us, just as the disciples were encouraged. Between the resurrection and the ascension Jesus went to look for the disciples, to tell them that it was all right — on the road to Emmaus, by the lake at Galilee, in a locked room. He explained to them what had happened, he offered them comfort and reassurance, he let them know that failure can be forgiven, he helped them to believe.

In some of the Lent services in the group we used an alternative invitation to communion. Instead of 'draw near with faith', the priest said: 'Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper.' The congregation replied: 'Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.'

'Lord, I am not worthy to receive you' - no, we none of us are, from the first disciples to now, because we have all failed in one way or another. 'But only say the word, and I shall be healed.' And it was to say that word, of forgiveness and acceptance, that Jesus went out to find the disciples, to help them to believe, to give them his peace. And it is to say that same word that he comes to meet us in our worship and in every Eucharist, not because we have earned it, not because we are worthy, but because he understands our human frailty, understands our failure, understands how difficult we can find it to truly turn to him and believe. May we accept Christ's forgiveness and healing, as we answer his call to his supper, and share in the bread and the wine and the blessing of God at his altar. Amen.

#### Clerk's notes of Parish Council Meeting at Braceborough Village Hall 2<sup>nd</sup> Apr 2012

The clerk reported that she had still not received a response from BT about painting the kiosk at Wilsthorpe but was informed that the post box had just been done. The water leak by the Cocked Hat at Braceborough had been dealt with. The Parish Council had registered with HMRC for PAYE and was awaiting further details but the annual VAT form had been completed with £60.31 to be reclaimed. Cllr. Susan Burgoin declared a personal interest in the planning application of Mrs Hawley. The Willows. It was agreed that there would be no representation for the change of use of part of the paddock area to a ménage. The meeting was also informed that the application for a grass airstrip at Manor Farm had been deferred. The application at Walnut Cottage, Braceborough had been approved. The clerk reported on the highways walkabout with Lincolnshire County Council. The main concern at Braceborough was the verge and roadside breakup opposite the church, resurfacing of Quincey's Lane and water along Church Lane. LCC have agreed to provide a disabled access to the Village Hall. At Wilsthorpe roadside breakup caused by the school bus would be dealt with in the spring. Other highways issues mentioned at the meeting were lack of numbers on lamp posts at Elliott's Way. Councillors were concerned about the reduced opening hours of the Household Waste Recycling centre at Bourne. It was agreed that the parish would not enter the Best Kept Village competition. The clerk informed the meeting that she had not received information regarding the sewerage scheme at Wilsthorpe apart from a map giving a proposed route from Barholm, Greatford to Wilsthorpe. The Parish Council has purchased Medals for children, 11 years and under, and will be presenting them on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> June. #### WILDLIFE GARDENING IN MAY

Last issue we talked about making a wildlife pond for the garden, and this month we promised some planting suggestions, so here goes. Pond plants provide habitat and food for wildlife (especially if the plants are native species), and add colour and variety to this part of the garden. They can roughly be divided into two groups: (i) aquatics comprising water plants that can be submerged or floating, and (ii) marginal plants adapted to growing in marshy areas at the water's edge or for example water covered planting shelves around the edge of the pond.

Lets have a look at aquatic pond plants. These are vital to a healthy pond, because they oxygenate the water necessary for aquatic animals and other plants. They're also hugely important in combating blanket weed. This weed (actually algae) is encouraged by conditions such as enriched water and excessive sunlight and its growth can quickly overwhelm all other plants in the pond. When it starts to die and decay, this leads to loss of oxygen in the water, so that most other pond inhabitants suffer.

A bucket of water and some oxygenating plants from a friends established garden pond (without blanket weed) is a good way to start off your new pond as beneficial aquatic fauna will be transferred as well. Saving that, a good garden centre should be able provide the plants you need. A word of caution though, should you come across plants such as Parrot's Feather, Water Primrose, Water Fern and New Zealand Pygmyweed, then avoid them entirely. They will over-run your pond and if they get out into the wild will harm wildlife and their habitats. Although people often introduce Canadian Waterweed (*Elodea canadensis*) as an oxygenator, avoid this as well as it spreads quickly and will soon clog up your pond. Bear in mind that a pond will naturally colonise in time with plants, but by introducing suitable species you are speeding up the process.

Good oxygenating plants on the must-have list could include Spiked Water-milfoil (with feathery green leaves), Curly Pondweed, Hornwort and Water Starwort - a delicate-looking plant forming light green rosettes on the water surface - which can cope with seasonal drought which may be an important consideration if we have a dry summer. It may be useful to try and 'anchor' some of these plants by tying a stone to a bundle of stems. Alternatively, just carefully pour them in and the plants will float until they become established.

For plants that have surface leaves and are bottom-rooted, try Broad-leaved Pondweed (oval dark green/brown leaves), Amphibious Bistort (floating leaves with lovely pink flowers standing proud of the water), Water Crowfoot (early season white flowers and small leaves) and Bogbean (blue/green, three-lobed leaves and large pink and white flowers). The latter also has thick stems that spread out over the top of the water. We think White and Yellow Water-lilies (*Nymphaea alba* and *N. lutea*) are best avoided for small ponds as they can grow very large and will need constant control and maintenance. A good alternative is Fringed Water-lily (*Nymphoides peltata*) that has yellow flowers and is smaller and much less aggressive. It is best to anchor these plants in baskets with hessian liners or in net pots using special pond-plant compost covered with a good layer of gravel. If you decide to use garden soil in place of pond-plant compost be sure it has not received herbicides or fertilisers that will encourage blanket weed. Baskets can be placed onto the bottom of the pond, using bricks or stones to ensure the correct depth, or on ledges at the sides.

Don't be in too much of a rush to plant up your pond. Give it some good thought first as to which plants you would like where, and the conditions that they require. Also consider that the optimum plant cover of the water surface is about two thirds. Finally for a wildlife pond, please don't put in fish as these will eat the wildlife and contribute to problems with blanket weed. Next month we will introduce you to the delights of marginal plants! **Donna & Tim**


