



Dear All

I've just been filling in the forms for a faculty – permission to do work in a church. Faculties are given from everything from major restoration and building work to putting in a new bookcase (the cause of the current paperwork) – for any change, addition or repair to the fabric or the appearance of the church.

It's difficult to understand sometimes why a simple repair or a piece of new furniture needs permission. It can get very frustrating, filling in forms and displaying notices and waiting for committees to meet. But I've heard enough horror stories to know why all churches have to ask permission to do things – and of course we have to be extra careful with our listed buildings. All of the churches in this group are listed, and that means they are of significance not only for churchgoers and the local community, but of importance to the wider community, buildings of architectural significance.

The churches in this group are looked after very well – but the rules are there for everyone, because sometimes things don't happen quite the way they should. Our new bookcase (for West Deeping, in memory of Rene Cutts) is going to be made locally, to fit the space and match the pews it will stand against – but it's not unknown for a congregation to get given something that doesn't suit the church or the space or the colour – well, you get my drift.

And then there was the friend of mine who went to a parish where they'd needed to do a bit of repointing to the wall of the church and the tower. They didn't ask for permission or speak to the architect – too much hassle, and possibly expense – they just got on and did it themselves. Unfortunately, they used modern mortar – if they'd followed the rules, they'd have been told it must be an old-fashioned lime mortar. The modern mortar didn't move with the stone as the weather changed, so a year or two down the line there was some very expensive damage to the stones. All the new mortar had to be removed, some stones replaced, and the proper mortar put in, and the simple repair turned into a major fundraising exercise.

So, irritating as it can be, I can see the point of the faculty system. And the trade-off is that, for most things, we don't then have to apply for planning permission or listed building consent, so at least there's only one set of forms to fill in – and the Diocesan Chancellor and the advisory committee do understand that, as well as being beautiful buildings, our churches are buildings in use, and sometimes changes need to be made to make them more usable, so that they are more practical and better suited to what we want to do now, without losing their beauty and importance at the centre of our communities. Our churches have changed massively over the centuries, built and rebuilt, pews added, galleries put in and taken away, fonts shifted or replaced, screens moved. We just need to be sure that the changes are the right ones to protect our churches as well as keep them as places for our worshipping communities to use – so I'll keep filling in the forms.







UFFINGTON

Church Flowers - none in Lent

Uffington WI. If you've bought a handbag at John Lewis, you're in good company - the Partnership sells more of them than any other UK retailer. And more people sleep between its sheets than any other British brand. These facts - and many more - emerged when Chris Briggs, the John Lewis Partnership's learning and development coach, spoke on its history at February's meeting of Uffington WI. The John Lewis story is the stuff of Sunday-night TV drama - orphaned early, a young man from a country town in early Victorian Britain comes to London, gets a good job in a department store (Peter Robinson) but turns down a coveted partnership because he's determined to run his own business. He buys a tobacconist's in Oxford Street in 1864 and goes on to extend into the properties adjoining it. He meets a pretty girl on holiday in Scotland, forgets about her (he's a busy man) and then, by chance, bumps into her again in London. They come from very different backgrounds, but they marry and have two sons, who join him in building up the company, acquiring other well-known businesses over the years. The elder, Spedan, a quiet philanthropist who liked to breed gibbons, goes on to mould and advance it in ways his father never dreamed of, introducing profit sharing and holiday hotels for its employees, known as 'partners'. John Lewis extended into food retailing with Waitrose (originally Waite, Rose and Taylor) in the 1930s, and in the 1940s several of its department stores, including Oxford Street, were destroyed by wartime bombing. Today there are 28 John Lewis stores and more than 200 branches of Waitrose. 'Never Knowingly Undersold' is the slogan for which the Partnership is universally remembered. but today it is guided by three further basic principles, said Mr Briggs; Be Honest, Give Respect, and Recognise Others. A vote of thanks was given by Alison Dodsworth. Members were reminded that 2012 subscriptions were due, and payment will also be required for the branch's annual birthday dinner, to be held on March 7, at the Garden House Hotel. West Deeping Heritage Group. Who would have thought that a talk on prehistoric West Deeping would draw such a crowd? The Village Hall was full to capacity for the meeting on 8th February. The audience heard for the first time the archaeologists' story of their excavation of the fields at Rectory Farm, West Deeping. Dr Jonathan Hunn supervised the site for 3 years from 1993, when the discovery of a Roman villa and bathhouse hit the national headlines. Several West Deeping residents attended the open day and saw some of the artefacts, but the report has yet to be published. The site was important as a "multi-period landscape" - with evidence of occupation from Neolithic times and continuous use by farmers through the Bronze and Iron Age until the late Romano-British period. Environmental archaeologist James Rackham held everyone's attention as he described the contents of waterlogged soil from the bottom of prehistoric ditches! Pollen and seeds tell us which trees and plants were growing nearby, and whether fields were used for meadow or crops. The audience was surprised to hear that the population of West Deeping was probably higher than it is now. (The total electorate, as of Feb 2012, is 225.) It was a fascinating evening, and is due to be followed up in the autumn with a talk on the most recent and equally exciting discoveries at the Rectory Farm site, by the current Project Manager, Simon Savage from Pre-Construct Archaeology.



Despite the inclement weather and the ground being very snowy and frosty approximately 35 people turned up and the money raised was £286.90p. John and Kathleen Knipe who hosted the event would like to thank everybody for their generous donations and help that ensured it being the success that it undoubtedly was, and also enjoyable. The community spirit is definitely present in Wilsthorpe.

WILDLIFE GARDENING IN MARCH

March sees the start of lots of wildlife activity. Many animals are searching for a mate and for suitable nesting places, as well as the on-going search for food and trying to avoiding predators.

Many of us will have seen hares racing around in the fields between the villages in the Uffington group. This month, hares can be seen 'boxing' (when they stand on their back legs and fight or box with their fore-paws). These 'mad March hares' can be easily spotted where the crops and grass fields are short. It used to be thought that these were fights between rival males but it is now known that these battles are almost nearly all the result of females (which are larger and heavier than males) fending off the advances of too amorous males.

Another sign of the forthcoming activity is the return of frogs and toads to their breeding ponds, when on wet nights in early spring some sections of our local roads are covered with migrating amphibians. Some of the animals must survive the passing of traffic because they are seen every year! The breeding areas include garden ponds, as well as farm and field ponds, and even water-filled ditches. Having arrived, pairing usually takes place in the middle of March or sometimes late February. Frog eggs are laid in jelly and masses of frogspawn are a familiar sight. Toad eggs are different in that they are laid in strings of eggs and jelly. The eggs are laid at the bottom of the pond and the 'jelly' absorbs water which causes the eggs to swell from about a few millimetres to about 1 centimetre, and the eggs rise through the water. The jelly gives the eggs buoyancy and keeps them in the warmer surface water (where they will develop quicker). It also cushions the eggs from physical damage and deters other animals from eating them. Newts also lay eggs underwater, but the female newt lays her eggs singly and wraps them carefully in a leaf for protection. Tadpoles will develop in a few weeks.

You will see and hear garden birds starting their courtship, including noisy crowds of house sparrows, dunnocks singing and male blackbirds being very territorial in the garden. Migrant birds will start to return at the end of March. Sand martins are the first to come back and can be seen swooping low over local reservoirs and lakes. They have a slightly forked tail, are white underneath with a brown 'chin strap' and brown upper feathers (unlike House Martins which have black upper feathers and no chin strap).

Next month we will talk about making a wildlife pond in the garden which is great for frogs, toads and newts, as well as for lots of other wildlife.




