

Dear Friends

I'm sure you've seen or heard about the legislation to allow women to be ordained as bishops, and the debate and vote that didn't happen last month at the General Synod – it's been postponed to November. You may have noticed, however, that I haven't written about it in Towers and Spires until now – partly because it's either a very short piece (should we have women bishops? – Yes) or a very long and complicated one (how do we prepare legislation that respects both those who are in favour of women bishops and those who are against, without dividing the church or having different grades of bishop – and that's the very simplified version). From various conversations I've had over the last few days, though, since the Synod met, I think the time has now come to try to look at what's happening.

You'll have worked out my opinion on the issue – I'm an ordained woman, ordained first as a deacon then as a priest, and of course I believe that women should also be ordained as bishops. As I saw on a sign at the time of the vote on the ordination of women as priests, 'Ordain women or stop baptizing us' – we're either an equal part of the church, the Body of Christ – or we're not part of it at all. Being a bishop is not something I'd thank you for myself, but there are some very able women in the church, and the whole Church of England is losing out if they're not able to serve to the best of their ability.

That doesn't mean, though, that I would support women becoming bishops at any price. If the cost is to have two types of bishop, with women and the men who ordain women being second-class bishops with restrictions on their ministry, then it is too high – and I think that was the danger with the amendment that the House of Bishops put to Synod, which caused the whole thing to be adjourned for further reflection.

As ever, we make the whole thing a complicated issue. It is right to try to keep as many people as possible as part of the Church of England, and to make these changes in such a way that people don't feel forced out – while remembering that some, even many, have also felt forced out because change hasn't happened, or only very slowly. But there is just one simple question which, as a church, we should answer, and which should guide our decisions: what does God want? Does God want a church in which men and women can serve equally, in whatever capacity they are called to serve, lay or ordained, priests or bishops? If the Church believes, as I do, that the answer is yes, then we must pass the legislation that will make it happen, so that we can truly be the Body of Christ.

Road closure: As previously announced, Lincolnshire Highways will be closing Stowe Bridge in Barholm ("the Red Bridge") for about four weeks – but the work has been postponed and should now start on 3 September. The official diversion route will be via Baston Road and King Street.

The village is again competing in the **Best Kept Village competition** – and having won the small village class in 2008, we are again competing in the special class for the past four winners of the small and medium sized village classes. Final judging takes place in August and September, focussing on tidiness (freedom from litter, tidy churchyard, well-kept gardens, verges, playing fields and footpaths), and how well the village is looked after. The Parish Council hopes that everyone will maintain the fine standard, and perhaps give front gardens, hedges and verges an extra tidy and trim in late July, as well as removing all litter (on which judges are normally very hot) to demonstrate our pride in the village, and try to repeat our 2006 victory in this "champions league."

WILDLIFE GARDENING IN AUGUST

Being out and about in gardens we have been struck by the number of slugs and snails on the rampage. No doubt they have enjoyed the damp conditions – the wettest June since records began, with a continuing trend into July! But the warmth and rain have also encouraged lots of plant growth and the soft and juicy growing tips are just what the slugs and snails like to eat. Wildlife in the garden can be a problem!

The first response can be to reach for the slug pellets. But before you do so, please remember that nature can be our friend too, and that even slugs and snails are part of a rich garden ecology. There are several species of slug that can be found in gardens including: Shelled, Large Red, Garden, Great Grey, Yellow, Netted and Keeled Slug. There is a similar variety for snails: Cellar Glass, Garlic Glass, Strawberry and Garden Snail, and the Romans introduced an edible species that can be found in some place in England – the Roman Snail.

Slugs and snails have a bad reputation for grazing the tender seedlings and carefully-nurtured prize plants such as Hostas, but they are the food of frogs and toads, hedgehogs and thrushes and these can all be considered the gardener's friends. Avoiding the use of pesticides will allow all sorts of natural predators to help you in the control of pests. The danger with slug pellets and other poisons is that the poison is passed on (and concentrated) through the food chain as predators eat the pests, so you can end up unintentionally poisoning thrushes and hedgehogs.

One other snail predator which is found in a few places nearby (such as Barnack Hills & Holes, some road-side verges and Ketton Quarry) is the glow-worm. These are actually beetles and famed for the light that the flightless females emit to attract mates. They are found in all sorts of grassland, including gardens, so worth looking out for on warm dry evenings in mid-July, in long-established grassland that has not been 'improved' with herbicides or pesticides.

Even if you are not lucky enough to have glow-worms in your garden, and the hedgehogs, toads and thrushes don't seem to be keeping on top of the slugs and snails, there are other things you can do to control these pests without using chemicals. Things which can help are beer traps (in which the slugs drown in a container sunken into the ground, half-filled with beer and with a slightly raised cover of wood or a stone), half grapefruit (leave the skins overnight and remove the slugs in the morning), sprinkling used coffee granules, crushed egg shells, fire-ash or grit amongst the tender plants, or go out with a torch in the evening and gather up the snails and slugs and dispose of humanely. Other possibilities are slug collars (plastic structures that surround plants and have a lip that apparently slugs don't climb over), slug bells that contain a snail/slug-repellent odour, and copper slug tapes that provides the beasts with a shock that prevents them climbing up beds or pots. You can also buy 'Nemaslug' which contains naturally-occurring microscopic nematodes (parasites) that seek out slugs and kills them. You can search on-line for examples of these particularly in organic gardening catalogues.



WILSTHORPE

Clerk's notes of Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Parish Council held on Monday 9th July at St Faith's Church, Wilsthorpe.

The little church of Wilsthorpe had not been so full since their very successful Jubilee celebrations at the beginning of June. With thirty four people in attendance Ian Boon. Anglian Water, gave a presentation on the First Time Sewerage Scheme which is due to commence in the village between November 2012 and March 2013. The greatest concern was the positioning of the pumping station on the verge between the Church and Church Farm. It was agreed that a more suitable site would be to the south of the village on farm land. The Parish Council adopted the Members Code of Conduct in accordance with the Localism Act 2011 in accordance with SKDC. The clerk gave an update on the work to be done on both village highways. She also reported that she had tried on several occasions to contact the local Neighbourhood Policing Panel but to no avail. There were various highways issues from lack of strimming being undertaken, verges not cut to their usual high standard and parking outside Greatford Village Hall. Cllr. Susan Burgoin reported that despite the weather on Sunday everyone enjoyed the Jubilee celebrations. It started with a church service in the morning followed by picnic in the Church in the afternoon, where the Jubilee Medals were presented. Cllr Kentish said that Braceborough enjoyed two days of festivities which included games, hog roast, Braceborough Choir and also presentation of Jubilee Medals to name just a few. Thanks to the Parish Council who purchased the Medals and C Cllr Martin Trollope-Bellew's Big Society Fund. C Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that the level crossing at Banthorpe would be closed for two evenings in July. He also informed the meeting that the County Council had approved a wind-farm policy which had been well received by many Councils. He also agreed that the quality of the verge cutting by contractors had been to a poor standard. The next meeting to take place on Monday 10th September 2012 at Braceborough Village Hall at 8pm. Parish Council. Report from the very acrimonious Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday. 20th June. 2012 at 8pm in the Village Hall. Attending were approximately 40 members of the public. PCSO Michelle Laughton and two persons from Western Power. Mr I Jarvie and his colleague from Western Power stated that the two pole transformers in Manor Field and Lindsey Road needed ungrading and a site suggested for a ground mounted substation was on the grass area near the Lindsey Road hammerhead. But it was explained to them that this land now belonged to the Parish Council and the agreement with Jelsons was that if the land was used for any purpose other than a play area it would revert back to Jelsons. So it was agreed that if this work was to be carried out an alternative site would have to be found. The grass on the various Parish Council verges still needs cutting but with the weather being so wet it was impossible to get on top of it at the moment. A Play Area questionnaire is to be circulated around the village and when it is returned the constitution will formulated and a Committee formed. County Councillor Martin Trollope-Bellew is trying his best to get the One-Way System scheme underway, the latest date is now August 2012. Jubilee Dance at Croft was a great success with a full barn dancing to the Wrinkly Rock Band. Almost £450 was raised which was split equally between the Church Roof, the Air Ambulance and the Play Area. As the weather was wet for the family picnic that was to be held at the Cricket Club it was held in the barn at Croft Farm. LCC Highways are giving the Parish Council a date for a walkabout around the village looking at the road and footpaths. There was much discussion regarding the erection of two 50kW wind turbines (max height 39.6 metres) at Casewick Farm, Tallington for Mr. N. Watts. Concern was expressed regarding their closeness to habitation, height. noise pollution and spoiling views over open countryside. It was stated that SKDC had no policy on wind turbines and was reluctant to adopt LCC's policy. The Parish Council would write strongly objecting to these turbines stating that if SKDC approved them without a policy it would set a precedent for any other wind turbine applications in this area.



1st Time Sewerage in Wilsthorpe. Thank you to everybody who attended the Parish Council Meeting on Monday 9th July and the presentation by Anglia Water - I think we all found it very interesting! Just to confirm briefly, the work is due to start on the 26th November 2012 and will take approximately 4 months [not allowing for bad weather over winter!], this timing should take into account the Christmas break. The road through the village will be closed but provision will be made for access [and of course emergency services should they be needed at any timel, this will be in agreement with LCC Highways. The main concern from most who were present was the siting of the Pumping Station. Anglian Water's preferred location [and cheapest from their point of view] is on the verge at the front of Mr Mastin's field, near the notice board and St Faith's Church. Whilst the sewerage scheme is definitely going ahead, the location of the pumping station is not a definite, as vet. This location would make the pumping station highly visible - if anybody would like to see an idea of how it would look, the one in Braceborough is located in Church Lane. We were advised by the representatives from Anglian Water that everybody who objected to this location should write to Anglian Water - a suggested letter objecting to the siting has been delivered to all residents in Wilsthorpe for signature and posting off to AWA. We are also advised to email the Clerk to the Parish Council, Rosemary Woolley bwparishcouncil@msn.com to voice our concerns as she will also be writing to Anglian Water on our behalf, and our emails will add extra strength to that letter. It is hoped to arrange another meeting with Anglian Water [& possibly the Highways Dept] at the October (9th) meeting of the Parish Council and for the meeting to be again in St Faith's Church.
