WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

ASB

The number of ASB incidents reported to us have continued to be low across the area. PCSO Everitt has been regularly patrolling parks and green spaces to engage with users. Halloween weekend did see a rise in complaints as we would expect, but there were much fewer complaints than in previous years.

In the run up to Halloween there have been reports of eggs being thrown at property as well as youths kicking front doors. There is evidence available to identify some offenders so the team will be dealing with all of those who can be identified.

Break ins

There were a number of break ins at the allotments in Hall Meadow Road on 22/10/2021, with a number of items being stolen. Due to the location there was unfortunately no available evidence to be able to identify any offenders. PCSO Everitt has spoken with a member of the allotments committee to provide crime prevention advice. Should any individual like further advice then please do get in touch.
