**3-3/26** – Public Forum

Members of the public were given the opportunity to discuss and update Council members on recent flooding that occurred on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March that affected their properties along Casewick Lane. It was established that LCC have acknowledged that there is a drainage problem along the whole of Casewick Lane. To be discussed fully on item 6

4-4/26 - Declaration of Interests

**5-5/26**– Highways

No further developments or information from LCC on the request for a 30mph extension along Greatford Road, request is ongoing and await formal review to be completed. Speedwatch group member recommend that they are yet to receive a receive response from the Lincolnshire road safety partnership from their enquiry for statistics. The white ornamental gate proposed for the village from SKDC funding could possibly obstruct the speedwatch radar gun. Coordinates will need to be checked with LCC and Lincs road safety along with the speedwatch group to ensure gate is properly positioned and will not interfere with the Speedwatch group in any way. Area outside of the Church footpath opposite the school to be fenced off for re-seeding. Problem parking around school areas was raised to Cllr Ashley Baxter and asked if there were any other enforcements that can be imposed. Unfortunately, all lines on the roads are advisory. Council members discussed if there could be a possibility that the school offered a road safety session with members of the Council, members of the speedwatch group and the Headteacher. To raise awareness around safety with speed and parking in and around the village. An idea was also proposed that children who walked to school from the designated parking areas could possibly obtain house points for their team. Clerk to contact Mr. Evans after the Easter break with the ideas put forward

## 6-6/26 - Flooding

Cllr Smith has raised all concerns on behalf of the residents in Uffington village and also Council members to the LCC team regarding the flooding and drainage issues in the village. Cllr Church believes there is an extensive problem with the whole system and a full drainage survey is needed. Regular gulley maintenance is also needed. Residents expressed their frustration that the problems have been regularly reported to LCC and they feel that their reports and concerns have been ignored. Work has been scheduled in June for curb stones. No definitive answer has been given about a drainage survey. Cllr Smith will chase with LCC. It was suggested that County Council officers meet with Council members and residents if there is a site visit.

8-8/26 – District Reports

Mayoral election and County Council elections next month (District council elections would have been due in 2027 if it weren't for local government reorganisation which may see them replaced with unitary authority elections)

Local Government Reorganisation: This will see the abolition of the two-tier system (District and County Councils) and new single tier (Unitary Authorities) formed. It is anticipated that reorganisation will be complete by 2028. National government requested that existing authorities submit proposals to them on how they would like to do this by 21 March 2025. This was debated by SKDC Full Council on 18th March. Merging with Rutland CC, North Kesteven DC and South Holland DC to form a single unitary authority was agreed as the preferred option. This would give a total population of around 410,000. Feedback is now awaited from Westminster to enable councils to form final proposals which are due for submission by 28 November 2025. It is anticipated that SKDC will be conducting a public consultation within that time. LCC have submitted two different preferred models, opting to split Lincolnshire into two unitary authorities. This would either put SKDC in with the rest of the current area covered by LCC or see LCC split north south with SKDC in with Lincoln, North Kesteven, Boston and South Holland. (SKDC's proposed three unitary authority model was supported by NKDC but not by SHDC who opted for a two unitary authority model but different from LCC's with the South of Lincolnshire comprising NK, SK, SH, Boston and East Lindsey.) Rutland CC's website state that they are involved in three different options, one of which is the model put forward by SKDC.

Greatford Quarry: Application to vary conditions with regard to the timing of road widening was refused
