



How's your Lent going?

It started with a bang!

For many of us, it started with a bang! We had over a hundred people at the first Ash Wednesday service to mark the start of this penitential season. This was a highlight as nearly everyone, tummies still full of pancakes, including Children, Teachers, Mums, Dads, Grannies and Grandads and members of the church family, left after having the sign of the cross marked on their foreheads. It is an emotional time as we are reminded of our mortality as were hear the words that remind us that life is short compared to the eternal life that awaits us. The other thing that caused a bang was the discovery of the theft of the lead from the roof of the chancel at Tallington. Of course, this was a low light! Just like the effect of receiving ashes, it is one that will affect us as individuals and a community for a long time. I'm very grateful for all of those in Tallington, and the many from the other villages and RAF Wittering who helped practically and emotionally - even those whose offers of help could not be accepted made a difference to those coping with the problems caused by the theft. More prayer and more resources, including money, will be needed to help us put things in order. I hope that we can find ways to work as the church with the wider community, including the care-home, Village Hall, Parish Council and The Whistle Stop Pub. It's all too easy to see the church as just the building, but in time I hope to be able to see that it is much more than that.

Fasting and Fasting

The main traditions of Lent require us to fast or abstain from food. We might remember these from our past, where the tradition still exists for many to abstain from eating meat on Friday; hence the popularity of fish on Friday. Lent starts and finishes with a fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that if you are able to, you should eat one less meal. For some these traditions have been lost. For many of the younger generations, these traditions are being rediscovered. An extreme version of this is following a vegan diet and the motivation is more about health of the individual or the planet. Whether for religious observance or animal/personal welfare I think that the more we consider what and how we eat, we may have a better idea of how our spiritual, mental and physical health is changed. When we choose to give things up, such as chocolate, the better they taste when we allow ourselves to eat them again.

Fire and Water

The Lent Bible study and Lent lunches (27th March) continue and as we get ready for Easter on the 21st April please consider what services you might come to. Both Palm Sunday services start with a short procession, and the week before Easter (Holy Week) has a variety of services to help you enter into the spirit of the season. May I wash your feet on Maundy Thursday?
