

VACANCY UPDATE FROM REVD LIS WARD

Dear Friends,

Before I came to work at St George's in Stamford nearly five years ago, I was working as a primary teacher. By this time of year everyone in school would be getting tired and looking forward to the summer holidays. I was always glad that the summer term brings plenty of distractions in school – sports days, visits out, special activities, end of year plays and class assemblies, but nothing was able to prevent that general weariness that comes when it feels like it is time for a rest, refresh and a new start in the autumn term.

Here in the villages if feels as if everyone has been waiting for a long time for the new Rector. The process of advertising and appointing never seems to be a quick one, although in real terms, considering all the practicalities of what needs to be covered - the paperwork, the liaison between parishes, the communications with the diocese - in some ways the process in the Group could be said to have gone through relatively fast. But there is inevitably a general weariness with any process of waiting for a successor to be appointed, whether within the church system or another situation. Those who have been involved in working so faithfully to maintain the smooth running of the parish churches and to ensure that the spiritual needs of your communities are covered are now able to look towards the end of this period of time and look forward to the new start that is coming.

A passage from the Bible that I have always found to be a great encouragement in weary times of waiting comes from Isaiah chapter 40, verses 30-31.

³⁰Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;
 ³¹but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength.
 They will soar on wings like eagles;

they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

As we all look forward to the appointment of the new Rector and the remaining time of waiting, it is good to be reminded by these verses that it is God who renews our strength when we are weary. As we put our trust in him his promise is that strength will be renewed, and there will be a new energy, a soaring on wings like eagles, as the journey we travel with him continues. Jesus promised his disciples the Holy Spirit would be with them after he returned to heaven, and it is that power within us as we believe his words, the same power that was in Jesus, that enables us to keep going when our life circumstances weary us, knowing we have that strengthening from within that never fails. For all within the villages who are weary, for whatever reason, my prayer this month is that you will indeed be able to put your trust and hope in the Lord, and know that he is giving you the strength to continue.



UFFINGTON WI

With Britain currently at the higher end of the 'severe' threat level for terrorist attacks, Uffington WI members received some timely advice at their June meeting from Adrian Parker, County Terrorism Security Advisor to Lincolnshire Police.

Mr Parker outlined the ways in which the public can protect themselves in crowded places such as shopping malls, railway stations and sports stadia by identifying and reporting suspicious items or behaviour and taking the correct action to prevent harm to themselves and others.

'Twelve attacks have been prevented in the UK since March 2017,' he said. Run, Hide and Tell are the keywords to remember if caught up in a random attack and a CitizenAid app is available to download on smartphones from citizenaid.org. Further information is available from the website Gov.uk/nactso.

At the business meeting which followed, members voted unanimously to donate £135 for new curtain poles in the village hall. A donation of £75 was agreed to the village Scarecrow Festival committee from the WI cake stall at this year's event.

CAN YOU HELP?

FAMILY HISTORY - SHARPE FAMILY OF UFFINGTON & BELMESTHORPE

I was born in Peterborough in the 1950s and moved south with my parents as a young teenager in the early 70s. Sadly my grandparents and parents have now passed on and I have no contact with any relatives on my father's paternal side - the Sharpe family

I have traced them back through Census/BMD records to Uffington as Agricultural Labourers in the 1700s and 1800s and have found a number of baptisms in Uffington for Sharpe's in the 1500s (although have not identified who is who yet this far back) so they appear to have lived in the area for a few hundred years. My great great grandfather John Sharpe (B.abt 1812) moved from Uffington to Belmesthorpe in the later 1800s with my Great Grandfather George Sharpe (B, abt 1871).George as a young adult moved to Stamford and then to Peterborough. John Sharpe married Catherine Hare in 1836 (B. abt 1809) who died after her 7th child and he remarried Ruth Whitehead (B. abt 1829) and had 5 more children, (my great grandfather was their last child). George Sharpe married Elizabeth Howitt (B. abt 1870) in 1845 and had 6 children (John Robert being my Grandfather.) With so many children there may still be descendents still around! I would love to hear from anyone who has any of these people in their own family tree or who knows anything about them. I would also love to hear from anyone who has done any research on the history of Uffington or Belmesthorpe. I am planning a personal Family History trip to the area late October to have a look at the villages and the churches where they would all have been baptised/buried. (although as poor agricultural labourers I doubt there will be any headstones). My email is lynneweyman@gmail.com (be careful with spelling!)





WW1 EXHIBITION TO BE HELD AT ST FAITH'S CHURCH 18th/19th AUGUST 2018




