Dear All

Well, it's been a long time coming, but at last I can write my final letter and say goodbye to you all.

As you know, my ill-health retirement was agreed months ago, but I've been stuck waiting for the Church of England Pensions Board to find me somewhere to live in retirement. It's the downside of having housing provided while you're in parish ministry – when you retire, you have to move out. And as I trained for ordination when I was still young, and hadn't bought a house, and as I'm single, so haven't got a husband's income to buy a house (and you can't do it on a stipend!), and as no-one has left me a house, the Pensions Board is my only option – and it's taken them quite a while.

Anyway, they've just let me know that they've finished the preparatory work on a bungalow they've found for me; as I write this, I'm getting ready to go and see it and get quotes for flooring (they take all the carpets, laminated floors etc. out), and will be moving in early June, as soon as I've officially retired on the 31st May and the new floors are laid.

I'm moving closer to my family – not the ones in Cyprus, but the English branch, in north Dorset. My address will be 21, Plantagenet Way, Gillingham, Dorset SP8 4TD (that's Gillingham with a hard g as in gold, not a soft one like the place in Kent pronounced Jilliingham!), if you'd like to keep in touch.

It's been very strange being here but off work for so long, especially having had my farewell service in June, but at least I've been able to do some sorting through paperwork, and it's brought back many happy memories, finding records of special services, pictures of wedding couples and babies, letters and cards people have sent over the years. It's good to have those memories to take with me; I hope I've left some happy memories behind, too.

So all the best to all the parishioners of the Uffington Group – those who live here, whether you come to church or not, and those who attend services here but live elsewhere. Many thanks for all the support I've been given over the last 18 years, and special thanks to Martin Brebner and everyone who's kept things going while I've been off sick – and I hope that you soon find someone to be the new Rector, to look after you and be looked after by you.

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

Two PCSO's attended the Annual Parish Meeting held at the Village Hall in March. They gave a comprehensive report relating to the last six months and how Lincolnshire Police have reduced the number of Wildlife crimes. Notes for the APM can be read on the parish website.

At the Parish Council Meeting the clerk reported that the finger post to Greatford, King Street, is currently on hold due to the amount of repairs in the system. Cllr Kentish will be pursuing the Community Wildlife Grant and contacting Bob Shepherd and all those who have registered to have owl & bat boxes. The Clerk reported that Lincs Road Safety Partnership will be providing more information to parishes about the Community Speed Watch speed gun scheme during April.

The Parish Council was pleased to provide grants towards the maintenance of St Faith's & St Margaret's churchyards during 2018.

Councillors had no objection to the proposed erection of a single storey link extension and first floor extension along with alterations at Glenside, Wilsthorpe. SKDC approved the application for alterations and extensions at Manor Farmhouse, Braceborough.

A number of residents had damaged vehicles due to potholes and roadside breakup on the highway. The County Councillor advised that they go onto the LCC website and complete a claim form. Concern was expressed about the lack of reinstatement of a public right of way after ploughing and damaged sign at Baston Road, Greatford/Wilsthorpe junction.

D.Cllr Dobson was asked to provide a waste bin at the layby by public footpath 6.

Finally the Chairman thanked Mr Paul Spence for helping clear the snow earlier in the month.
