

The readings at Holy Communion are normally the NT and Gospel, and at Morning and Evening Prayer are usually Psalm, OT and NT (but do check with the preacher).

The Epiphany (the visit of the wise men to the infant Jesus, 12 days after his birth) and Candlemas (the Presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple 40 days after his birth) are two of the nine "Principal Feasts" of the Church – and although strictly they fall this year on weekdays, like many other churches we will celebrate them on the most appropriate Sunday. The liturgical colour in January is white (or white & gold, if available, on Epiphany Sunday & Candlemas Sunday), changing to green for the Sundays before Lent.

UFFINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Report from Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday, 8th November, 2017 in the Village Hall.

The big clean - It was thought that this has made a positive improvement to the village.

Parish Clerk - Lorraine Thurston was offered the position of clerk for a probationary period of three months. At the end of this period Lorraine will be employed at the discretion of the council.

Play area - Following recommendations on safety the Councillors agreed to form a working party to remove the brambles and move the fence around this area. Palings will also be spaced further apart. Hedgerow damaged during other works to be replaced.

Defibrillator - The total cost for the project is in the region of £2000. Fundraising plans and grant sources were discussed.

Refurbishment of village sign - The sign is drying out but appears to be in good order and will be referred to a professional for re-painting.

Allotments - Several of the tenants have planted trees and have plans to re-dig the pond and erect new fencing. It was agreed that any surplus funds from allotment rents could be allocated to this project.

Pot Holes on Lindsey Road - Reported to highways. Date of next meeting Wednesday 20th December at 8pm.

Dear Friends

May I wish you all a happy new year, and I hope that you also had a very happy Christmas.

The turn of the year may bring thoughts of events that will happen in the next twelve months: possibly major sporting events like those that happen every four years – the Winter Olympics, the Commonwealth Games, or football's World Cup; or perhaps more personal events like big round birthdays or anniversaries. Some folk will have other very special events to celebrate this year – we already have a number of weddings booked in our churches this year (and indeed have several weddings booked for 2019), and we look forward to helping the couples and their families celebrate these great occasions. Similarly we look forward to celebrating enlargement of families when children are brought to our churches for baptism, and sadly in the coming year we will no doubt be sharing during funerals in our churches the sorrow of those who have lost loved ones.

Our churches are available for these "life events" for all who live in our seven parishes, and indeed for those who live outside our seven villages but who have some connection with them, whether or not they regularly worship with us. The qualifying rules for getting married in a particular parish were greatly broadened a few years ago and now, for example, permit marriage in any parish in which a person or their parents have at any time lived for more than six months, or a parish in which their parents or grandparents were married. It is generally preferable for children to be baptised in the places where they live, but they can take place here, with consent of vicar of parish of residence. And we can be pretty flexible about hosting a funeral for anyone associated with our parishes – though the space in our churchyards means we can normally bury only those resident in our parishes at the time of death (and of course West Deeping churchyard has been closed for burials for many years).

And on a weekly, and indeed daily basis, our churches are here for the benefit of every parishioner – churchgoer or not – and we are always willing to share in the concerns (or joys) of all residents, for example in praying for all those who are poorly or in need. Sadly we can't always pray specifically for everyone within our parishes who might be in need of prayer – not because we don't want to do so, but because we don't always know about the illnesses, sorrows or other troubles that folk may be experiencing. We are very receptive to requests "to say one for me" – just e-mail me (rev.martin.brebner@btinternet.com) with any request (though do say whether any individual concerned is content for their name to be made public). The focus does not need to be solely personal: neighbourhoods, communities, schools etc, and indeed the nation and other lands might equally benefit from divine intervention, and when we seek God's help perhaps we will be better able to handle and even enjoy whatever the coming year holds for us, as individuals or as wider communities.




