### We will remember them .....

At the end of March we will be marking the centenary of the death on active service of another of the men honoured on the First World War memorials in our parishes:

**Lance Corporal Arthur Empson** of the 13<sup>th</sup> Battalion of The King's (Liverpool Regiment) died on 28<sup>th</sup> March 1918.

Arthur Empson was born in Dunsby in 1893, but by 1901 his family were living in Main Street, Greatford and the 1911 census records that Arthur was living with his parents, two sisters and a brother at No 25 Greatford (understood to be Manor Farm Yard). Arthur was a *Horseman on Farm*; his father (Henry Empson) was *Shepherd on Farm*.

Arthur married Kate A Beeston in 1915 in Newark, Nottinghamshire; they had one child (Thomas H Empson, born in Newark in December 1915). Arthur enlisted in the army in Newark and initially served in the Sherwood Foresters (Notts and Derby Regiment). He may not have seen significant active service with the Sherwood Foresters, but transferred to the 13<sup>th</sup> Battalion of The King's (Liverpool Regiment) which had been involved in many major actions and taken considerable casualties. From mid-1916 the Battalion was one of those which took part in the first phase of the Battle of the Somme and then the subsequent actions in autumn 1916. During 1917 the Battalion fought to the north of the Somme and then around Ypres, before returning south to the Arras area by the spring of 1918.

Arthur was one of 80 men of the Regiment who died on 28 March 1918 (the day on which the German spring offensive was extended to Arras). Like Arthur, nearly all of his comrades who fell that day are commemorated on the Arras Memorial. This memorial bears the names of nearly 35,000 British and Commonwealth servicemen who died in the Arras sector between the spring of 1916 and August 1918, but who have no known grave (though their bodies may be in one of the many graves in the area bearing the inscription *A soldier of the Great War known unto God*).

After Arthur's death, Kate married Harry Baumber in Q1 1919 in Newark. Arthur's father (Henry) had died on 30 December 1915 and is buried in Greatford churchyard. Arthur's mother (Sarah) was still living in Greatford at the start of the Second World War, as was Arthur's younger brother (Harold) and his wife (Lily). Sarah died on 11 March 1954 and is also buried in Greatford churchyard. Other relatives also remained in the area, and some of their descendants remain in south Lincolnshire to this day.

Arthur was 25 years of age when he died, and as a son of Greatford he is commemorated on the war memorial in St Thomas Becket Church, Greatford, where the centenary of this death will be remembered during the 9am service on 25<sup>th</sup> March.

### Dear Friends

The print deadlines for this magazine mean that on the day after Ash Wednesday I am having to think about what time the sun will rise on Easter Day - so that we can advertise in this edition the starting time of the Dawn Service on that day!

But while planning ahead to the great Christian festival which this year falls on 1 April, it is also important to savour the season of Lent, including the special events which occur in the next few weeks.

Our first special occasion in March is Mothering Sunday on 11<sup>th</sup> March, when in line with recent practice there will be joint Uffington & Tallington service – this year in Tallington Church at 10:30 (to be conducted by Canon Steve Simcox); there will also be a Mothering Sunday service in West Deeping Church at 10:30 (conducted by the All Age Worship team), and a service of Holy Communion in Greatford Church at 9am (where folk will have to put up with me). We don't expect children to follow the ancient practice of children scouring the country lanes to pick wild flowers give to their mother as a small gift – posies will be available for children (of all ages!) to give to mothers.

Then in the last week of March we celebrate the roller coaster of events at the heart of the Christian gospel – recalling first Christ's dramatic entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday; then the Last Supper that He shared with His disciples on Maundy Thursday; His crucifixion on Good Friday; and finally His glorious resurrection on Easter Day.

On Palm Sunday (25<sup>th</sup> March), the traditional palm crosses will be distributed during the services at Greatford, West Deeping, Uffington and Tallington. Like last year, there won't be services in our churches at the beginning of Holy Week, but the Bishop of Lincoln has just sent his annual command to clergy to attend *The Chrism Eucharist* which takes place in Lincoln Cathedral on the Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> March at 11am. This is the rather moving annual service at which the clergy renew their ordination vows and the oil to be used by clergy for anointing within their parishes is blessed by the Bishop. The Bishop's letter says "*I hope you will extend an invitation to members of your congregation to come to the service*" – so consider yourselves invited! (And do consider attending.)

On Maundy Thursday we will have a special service of Holy Communion at 7pm in St Margaret's Church, Braceborough focussing on the Christ's commands to his disciples during the Last Supper. And on Good Friday there is a morning service at West Deeping at 10:30am; then an opportunity to mark Christ's last hour on the cross at a service at Uffington at 2pm; and finally reflections on the Passion at Barholm at 7pm.

On Easter Day there will be the usual dawn service (at 6am so that you can fully savour the rising sun as well as celebrating Christ's resurrection) at Wilsthorpe. With the help of our friends in Stamford and Market Deeping, our Easter Day Communion Services will be at their normal times: Barholm, Braceborough & Greatford 9am, and Tallington, Uffington, West Deeping & Wilsthorpe at 10:30am.

At whatever time suits you, do come and join us during this special season of the Christian year so that we can celebrate anew with you the love of God demonstrated in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and the new life He gives us.

#### **Dear Resident**

To date the working group looking at the impact of switching off the County owned street lights at midnight have been briefed by the Road Safety Partnership, Ambulance Service and Lincolnshire Police.

The highways team have repaired 90,000 potholes, resurfaced 27 miles of road and surface dressed 190 miles of carriageway across the county during this financial year.

'Fairer Funding for Lincolnshire' has the backing of all Lincolnshire MP's apart from Lincoln, plus it has been mentioned in parliament, a consultation has been launched (deadline 12.03.18) which can be found at www.gov.uk/government/consultations/fair-funding-review-a-review-of-relative-needs-and-resources

Lincolnshire Police have agreed to increase their precept by 5.8% which will allow funding for 1100 regular officers and 120 PCSO's. This still makes Lincs Police the 4<sup>th</sup> lowest funded force in country.

Lincolnshire County Council along with other agencies has been supporting the 'LEADER' grant fund provided by the EU.
