Dear Friends

On New Year's Eve, my eye lighted on an article in the Sunday Times which reported that the law on registration of marriages is going to be changed so that the names of the mothers of the bride and groom will in future be included on marriage certificates and in the marriage registers (in addition to the fathers' names, which are currently included). The campaign for including mothers' names has been running for some time, and when I first heard of it I thought this would be good for future family history researchers, but there would be considerable cost replacing every marriage register in the country (every parish church has two of these sizeable books, not to mention registry offices). But while chatting to Carolyn about this a while ago, she commented that she had started offering couples the opportunity have mothers' names on wedding certificates and in the registers, by inviting their mothers to be the official witnesses, and in the past year I've told wedding couples of this possibility and most of them who were in a position to do so have leapt at the idea. And when on New Year's Eve I suggested in the Sunday Times on-line forum on the article that folk could anticipate the change in the law by adopting our practice my comment attracted the highest number of "recommended" hits out of all the comments on the article - so on this score it looks as though what we tend to do in the Uffington Group of Churches today is what the rest of the country wants to do tomorrow!

Looking at what our Group of Churches wants to do tomorrow, the Church of England Pensions Board has now secured a retirement bungalow for Carolyn (after two prospective purchases unfortunately fell through), and as soon as some refurbishment has been completed Carolyn will be able to move. The Diocese will then formally be able to announce the vacancy, publish the Benefice Profile (a fairly full summary of the nature of the seven parishes and what in a secular job advert would be called a person specification), and invite applications for the post of Rector. Applications will be sifted by a panel comprising a representative of each of our seven parishes, the Bishop, Archdeacon and Rural Dean and the shortlisted candidates will then be interviewed (by the same panel). Many clergy have to give three months' notice to leave their present appointments so it will still be a little while before we can look forward to welcoming our next Rector. But in the meanwhile we hope folk in the seven parishes will individually or with others in the Group continue to pray for our churches: for all who worship in our churches, who are baptised or married in them, or whose passing is marked by funerals in them; for the on-going work of the church in the Group, for visiting ministers, our ministry team, the churchwardens, and PCCs of the parishes, and all the people who do so much to look after our seven churches; for those responsible for the various steps of the vacancy process, and that the appropriate person will hear God's call to the Uffington Group of Parishes; and for Carolyn as she prepares to move and settle into her retirement bungalow and seek to discover God's plan for her retirement ministry, and giving thanks for the ministry here over the last seventeen years and for the impact that she has had within our villages.
