



Then during the Easter season, the Acts' reading is always used at all services, so the readings are the New Testament lesson and the Gospel passage. The liturgical colour throughout May is white, and changes to Red on 4th June.

Dear Friends.

The copy deadline for this magazine means that I am writing this on Easter Monday, having enjoyed a week of recalling the roller coaster of the events at the heart of the Christian gospel, from Christ's tumultuous welcome into Jerusalem by the palm waving crowd, through the Last Supper followed by Christ's arrest, trial and crucifixion, to the glorious resurrection on Easter Day, followed by a degree of relaxation on Bank Holiday Monday — I hope that you enjoyed the Easter weekend, in whatever way you spent it.

There are of course only a limited number of great festivals of the church – roughly the same number as bank holidays – and between them life goes on, though in every church (at especially at every Holy Communion service) we recall regularly the Last Supper and the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and what that means for us. And increasingly, especially under the Diocese's Discipleship Initiative, we are considering how we can enhance the work of the church, including what we can do to understand better the Christian faith and indeed deepen our belief; how we can improve our worship, and make our activities more helpful and enticing to all who come through our doors; and how to make our church buildings more fit for purpose in the 21st century: the installation of a loo being high on several parishes' agenda – a very desirable and practical facility, not least as folk attending services like baptisms, weddings and funerals seem to be arriving from ever greater distances.

Towards the end of May, the church nationally (and indeed internationally) is encouraging a special period of prayer for the work of the church, and that people will gain a closer understanding of God's love for every individual. This venture, entitled *Thy Kingdom Come*, is to take place in the nine days between two forthcoming great festivals of the church: Ascension Day (the celebration of Christ's return to heaven) and Pentecost (when the original disciples experienced the coming of the Holy Spirit): this year falling on 25th May and 4th June. We will be marking the opening of this period with a special service of Holy Communion in St Martin's Church, Barholm on Thursday 25th May at 7pm – it's not a bank holiday, but it's a special day for the church, and everyone would be very welcome – and feel free to tell me what we should do better in our seven parishes, and ask God to help us do it.

Carolyn continues to be signed off work (until the end of April) – we wish her well and hope that she will soon have better news; if necessary the help that we are currently receiving from the churches of Stamford will be rolled forward to ensure that the work of the church in our seven parishes continues.





We will remember them

In May, we will mark the centenaries of the deaths on active service of four men honoured on the First World War memorials in our parishes:

Private G F Roffe of the 1st/4th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 2nd May 1917.

George Francis (Frank) Roffe was born in 1892, the son of John Bryan Roffe and Mary Alice Roffe. John had been born in Wittering in 1856, but had sailed from Liverpool for New York on 6th May 1891 on the SS Majestic. George Francis and his younger brother (Edwin, b1894) were born in America. By 1898 the family had returned to Wittering where further children were born. Mary died in 1909 aged 36.

George Francis married Elizabeth A Chamberlain in 1912 in Stamford, and they lived in Castle Street, Stamford, where a son, Albert F Roffe, was born to them in 1914. Newspaper reports of the time suggest that George Francis was a farm worker who worked on farms in and around Uffington. He enlisted in the army early in the war, and served in the 1st/4th Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment (a territorial battalion). He went to the front around the beginning of 1916 at a time when the Battalion was moving from Egypt to France. The Battalion then took part in some actions on the Somme in the summer and autumn of 1916, and in the spring of 1917 was involved in pursuing the German army as it withdrew to the Hindenburg line. In the subsequent on-going skirmishes around the Hindenburg Line, George Francis was one of several men of the Battalion who were killed on 2nd May 1917. He was 27 years old when he died, and in view of his connection with Uffington he is named on the war memorial in St Michael and All Angels' Church. He will be commemorated at the 10:30am service there on 7th May.

Sapper Harold Bertie Holmes of the 83rd Field Company, Royal Engineers died on 4th May 1917. Harold Bertie Holmes was born in South Luffenham in 1895, the youngest of William and Elizabeth Holmes' three sons. By 1911, the family had moved to Braceborough where William was a coachman and Bertie was a farm labourer. Bertie also sang in the choir at St Margaret's Braceborough and was a bell-ringer. Bertie enlisted in Royal Artillery in May 1915, but was discharged on failing the test to be a shoeing smith. In the autumn he re-enlisted in Royal Engineers as a blacksmith, and went to France in January 1916, serving in the 83rd Field Company (attached to the 20th Division of the British Army). The Division saw action near Ypres in June 1916 and then took part in the later phases of the Battle of the Somme (from mid-July to November). In 1917 the Division helped pursue the German army as it withdrew to the Hindenburg line, and then sought to pin them down, but on 4th May Bertie was hit by a German shell. Bertie was 21 years old when he died, and as a son of Braceborough, is named on the memorial is St Margaret's Church, Braceborough where he will be commemorated during the 9am service on Sunday 7th May.

Private James Herbert Jarvis of the 11th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment died on 12th May 1917. James Herbert Jarvis was born in Tallington in 1897, the eldest of James and Fanny Jarvis' seven children. James (senior) was a farm labourer, and had married Fanny Wilson (of Market Deeping) in 1895, setting up home in Church Lane, Tallington. James (senior) died in the summer of 1916. Fanny continued to live in Tallington, being resident in the Feoffee Cottages in 1939, and died in 1945. James Herbert enlisted in the army soon after the outbreak of war (at the age of 17) and served in the 11th Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment. The Battalion took part in the later stages of the Battle of Loos in October 1915, and continued to be engaged in on-going trench warfare in the Loos area in spring 1916 before moving to the Somme area to become involved in the second and subsequent phases of the Battle of the Somme. Towards the end of 1916 the Battalion moved north to Arras, spending a quiet winter there before taking part in the major offensives around Arras in April and May 1917. In the Battle of Bullecourt (3-17 May) the Battalion took huge casualties, and 72 officers and men died - 40 dying on 12th May, 34 of these, including James Herbert, having no known grave and being commemorated on the Arras Memorial. James Herbert Jarvis was 19 years old when he died; and as a son of Tallington, he is named on the war memorial in St Lawrence Church. He will be commemorated during Evening Prayer at St Lawrence on Sunday 14th May.

Private Robert French formerly of the 3rd Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 17th May 1917. Robert French was born in Tallington in 1877, the son of Samuel and Jane French - Samuel was an agricultural labourer. Robert married Sarah Hanay Wilkinson in August 1905 in Gedney, but they set up home in Tallington. Robert was an estate worker and subsequently a domestic gardener, becoming head gardener at Casewick to the 2nd and 3rd Lord Kesteven, and the Hon. Nesta Trollope. Robert and Sarah had son, Sam, born in Tallington in April 1906. Robert enlisted in the army on 10th December 1915 (at the age of 38), and was mobilised on 25th August 1916, being posted to the 3rd Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment. This was a training unit, which remained at Grimsby throughout the war. On 12th January 1917 Robert was deemed unfit for military service, because of illness, and he was discharged 2nd February 1917 (his discharge papers recording that he was of good military character, and was "honest and clean"). Robert died of pneumonia on 17 May 1917 in Kesteven County Asylum, Quarrington, but his body was brought back to Tallington for his funeral. Robert was 39 years old when he died, and as a son of Tallington and former member of the armed forces, he is named on the war memorial in St Lawrence Church; he will be commemorated during Evening Prayer on Sunday 14th May.
