

We will remember them

In April, we will mark the centenaries of the deaths on active service of two men honoured on the First World War memorials in our parishes:

Lance Corporal John Henry Allen of the 8th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 20th April 1917. John had been born in 1878 in Barholm, where his father was an agricultural labourer. John married Emily Dawson in 1909 and they set up home at 17 Barholm, where they had a daughter Kathleen (born January 1914); John was an estate worker. He enlisted in the army in July 1916, and was posted to the 8th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment, joining the Battalion during the later stages of the Battle of the Somme. Then in spring 1917 the Battalion took part in the Battle of Arras – a major British offensive aimed lasting at breaking the stalemate that had set in. Over 100 men of the 8th Lincolnshires died during the fighting between 20th & 28th April, many of them, like John, being commemorated on the Arras Memorial as they have no known grave – though he may have been one of the unidentified bodies buried in one of the many graves in the area with a headstone denoting A soldier of the Great War, known unto God. John was 39 years old when he died, and as a son of Barholm he is named on the war memorial in St Martin's Church, and will be remembered there during the 9am service there on 16th April.

Lance Corporal Bertie Genever also of the 8th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 23rd April 1917. Bertie was born in 1895 in Uffington, the son of Joseph and Eliza Genever - he had ten siblings. Bertie enlisted in the Lincolnshire Regiment in Stamford in 1915 and served in the 8th Battalion, and was among those in the first wave of the Battalion to land in France (on 10th September 1915). The Battalion was almost immediately plunged into the Battle of Loos where it suffered huge losses (including Frank Wise of Uffington, Francis Tomblin of Barholm and Tom and Charles Lunn of West Deeping, who had all enlisted in Stamford at the same time as Bertie). After the Battalion was reinforced it moved further south, and in 1916 was engaged in various phases of the Battle of the Somme, in which the Battalion again took heavy casualties. Then in spring 1917 the Battalion took part in the Battle of Arras, during which Bertie was killed and like John Allen is commemorated on the Arras Memorial (having no known grave, though he too may be buried in a grave under a headstone denoting A soldier of the Great War, known unto God). Bertie was 21 years old when he died, and as a son of Uffington is named on the war memorial in Uffington Church, and will be remembered during the 10:30 service there on 23rd April.

Two further centenaries will be commemorated on 7th May: Bertie Holmes at Braceborough's 9am service and Francis Roffe at Uffington's 10:30 service; their life stories will appear in next month's Towers & Spires.

Dear Friends

In mid-April we celebrate the dramatic events at the heart of the Christian gospel – starting with the commemoration of Christ's dramatic entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the Last Supper that He shared with His disciples on Maundy Thursday, His crucifixion on Good Friday to His glorious resurrection on Easter Day.

All these events will be marked in our churches, starting on Palm Sunday (9th April), when the traditional palm crosses will be distributed during the services at Greatford, West Deeping, Uffington and Tallington. This year, we won't be arranging services in our churches at the beginning of Holy Week, but I would like to draw attention to The Chrism Eucharist which takes place in Lincoln Cathedral on the Tuesday 11th April at 11am. This is an annual service at which the clergy renew their ordination vows and the oil to be used by clergy for anointing within their parishes is blessed by the Bishop – there is a three line whip for clergy, and "clergy are reminded to invite members of their congregation to come to this service" – you are all therefore cordially invited! It is actually quite a stirring and moving service, and the sight of (nearly) all the clergy in the Diocese processing in the Cathedral is quite remarkable! I have three spare seats in my car for anyone wanting to attend. Then on Maundy Thursday we will have a special service of Holy Communion at 7pm in St Margaret's Church, Braceborough focussing on the Christ's commands to his disciples during the Last Supper.

On Good Friday there is a morning service at West Deeping at 10:30am, this is slightly earlier than in past years, to allow those who wish to do so to join the walk of witness in Stamford at 12noon (there won't be an organised walk from West Deeping to Uffington this year in view of the dwindling support in recent years). Later there is an opportunity to mark Christ's last hour on the cross at a service at Uffington at 2pm, and we close Good Friday with reflections on the Passion at Barholm at 7pm.

On Easter Day there will be the usual dawn service (at 5:45am) at Wilsthorpe when we will celebrate the light of Christ with the sunrise. With the help of our friends in Stamford and Market Deeping, our Easter Day Communion Services will be at their normal times: Barholm, Braceborough & Greatford 9am, and Tallington, Uffington, West Deeping & Wilsthorpe at 10:30am.

Carolyn has now been signed off work until the end of April, and we are grateful to the clergy of Stamford and Market Deeping for continuing to work alongside our own hard working ministry team of John Batty, Susanna Aldred, Les Baillie and Allan Crowson to maintain the work of the church; do come and join us during this great season of the Christian year so that we can celebrate anew with you the love of God demonstrated in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and the new life He gives us.

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE

It has been brought to the Parish Council's attention that there is an increase in people exercising their dogs in the villages, particularly along Braceborough Spa. Many dog owners bag their pets waste and take it home for disposal, however there have been many occasions when that waste has been bagged but left on the side of the road or on hedges. THIS IS BAD, if not worse than not clearing up at all, many of these bags are not biodegradable, so PLEASE take them home for disposal. Dog fouling is a criminal offence and the crime can be reported to South Kesteven District Council via their website www.southkesteven.gov.uk. Thank you.

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

Concern was expressed during the Public Forum about Lincolnshire County Council switching off street lights and the effect it could have on emergency services.

It was agreed that the Clerk would contact SKDC Street Scene about cleaning up of footpath between Walnut Cottage & the Village Hall. The Chairman thanked Cllr Morriss for delivering notices around the village asking people to clean up after their dogs. LCC Highways reported that the pothole crew were briefed to use their own judgement when disposing of excess at the end of their shift. It was proposed that the Parish Council would look at taking over the amenity grass cutting if funding was available from the County Council. Residents are still asked to continue to look after their verges. It was proposed that the Parish Council would apply for a grant from SK Community Fund to purchase their own Reactive Speed Sign.

The Council had no objections to the following planning applications:-OHL Ltd, Manor Farmhouse, Mr Morriss at Walnut Cottage. Mr Gracey, Holland House & Mr Collins at Ivy Farm Cottage both had their applications approved. Concern was expressed about the Cart Hovel, Church Lane as it was felt it was in a dangerous condition.

C.Cllr Martin Trollope-Bellew reported that the budget had been set at 3.95%, the council will be taking 13million from its reserves. The proposed referendum on Unitary Authorities in May would not be going forward. The draft Minerals & Waste Plan had been sent to the Inspector.

D.Cllr Barry Dobson reported that the district had increased it proportion by £4 per year on a Band D property. There had been a debate about the problems of hare coursing. SKDC are looking at increasing its stock of rentable accommodation, and that the district has no intension of switching off street lights at this present time.

Next meeting Monday 3rd April 2017 at the Village Hall at 7.30pm which will include the Annual Parish Meeting. This is an occasion for electors to raise any concerns they may have.

In March the District Council agreed to increase their portion of council tax by £4 per year on a Band D property instead of the £5 proposed which equates to 7.5p per week increase.

Cllr Rosemary Woolley held a meeting with the new Chief Constable at Deeping to discuss the growing menace of illegal hare-coursing which has seen an increase in the south of the county. If you come across an incident please try to get the vehicle registration number and report immediately to the police but keep your distance these are very dangerous people.

The District is proceeding with the new Local Plan which sets out the districts direction for development for the next 20 years. A consultation document will be available for residents to comment in the near future.

SKDC has no intension, at this present time, to alter the street lights which are looked after by that council, the ones which may be switched off at midnight belong to the County Council.

SKDC is still offering grants to communities who wish to improve their area. This could be repairing or altering public buildings or creating orchards for public use, the list is large.
