



One of the many privileges of being Bishop of Lincoln is the joy of travelling round the beautiful counties of the diocese, discovering so many interesting places and meeting more inspirational and humbling people than I could ever number. During the month of July, I will be travelling much further than usual, however: to Fiji, to represent the Church of England at an international consultation. I will be one delegate among many from around the world, all of whom will be representing their part of the Anglican Communion. My fellow delegates and I will gather from dioceses and provinces as diverse as Brazil, The Philippines, Central Africa, The Indian Ocean, Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia, and Jerusalem and the Middle East, as well as from England.

We meet as delegates of USPG, a mission agency that believes that every person and every community should be able to live a full life. I will be travelling right around the world to attend the consultation, and meeting partners who face very different challenges from our own. Many of them face daily struggles with the effects of climate (or climate change), geography, war, poverty or famine. Yet I am struck by how similar USPG's belief is to our own desire here in the diocese of Lincoln to see lives transformed through an encounter with the living God.

As members of the same human family across the world, all of us created and loved by God, we are united by so much more than the things that might divide us. I continue to pledge myself to do my part in the building up of God's kingdom in our diocese, so that all the members of this part of the human family have the opportunity of a full life, and to become the people that God has created them to be.

May God bless all his people, wherever they may be, and may the message of his love for the world continue to inspire us in the work of transformation to which he has called us.

#### Dear Friends,

Are you feeling fit? By the time this comes through your door, Wimbledon will be in full swing, and most of us will be being put to shame by all those super-fit bodies bounding around, making the tennis courts look tiny as they dash all over the place. I know I was never going to be that fit - but then I go to the school or watch toddlers playing, and see the energy of the children, and I *can* remember the days when I, too, played outside for hours on end, cycled everywhere and didn't know what an aching muscle was.

I'll never recapture the boundless energy of childhood, but it does seem that the more exercise we do, the more we're capable of doing for longer. I took the funeral of a 94-year-old who had not only played tennis and golf as long as she was able, but had done her exercises every day almost to the end. Keeping active kept her going. And the same seems to apply to our minds - we're told that the more we use our brains, the longer we're *able* to use them, so doing puzzles and thinking about things can keep our minds active.

It's not good news for the lazy. If we want to stay active, we obviously have to put some effort in. Walking, swimming, gardening - reading, discussing, learning new skills - we need to use our bodies and our minds if we want to carry on using them for as long as possible.

And it's not only minds and bodies. Souls need exercise, too. We get out of practice at spiritual matters just as easily, then wonder why there seems to be something missing from our lives, why we feel somehow unfulfilled. We need prayer and worship, we need to appreciate the beauty around us - the beauty of creation, of art and music, of love - we need to explore the meaning of our lives. So let's hope that, even if we don't have the energy and enthusiasm of childhood, we can find enough energy to keep exploring the world around us, and exercising our bodies, minds and souls, so that we can be fulfilled in all we do for a long time to come.





#### **GARDENING & WILDLIFE IN JULY**

Bee Orchids can pop up almost anywhere, although they tend to prefer grasslands, dunes, gardens, disturbed ground and quarries on chalk- or limestone-rich soils. They are found in England and Wales, especially in south and east England, but are rare in Ireland and absent from Scotland.

In any one place, their numbers can vary hugely from year to year: sometimes producing hundreds of flowers in one year, then none the next! They have been seen in several of our villages over the years, and one or two have just recently been spotted in West Deeping!

They are so-called because each flower appears to have a bumble bee resting on it and drinking nectar. But in fact the flower is so marked to mimic a bee, in order to attract another bee intent on mating. The flower's pollen gets transferred on to the real bee, which eventually flies off to try its luck on another flower, thus transferring pollen from one flower to another!

Each orchid has a single flower-stem produced in June and July (6-24ins / 15-60cm high), with oval unspotted leaves that decrease in size up the stem. The outer petals of each flower are pale pink, with the inner ones pinkish-green.

Bee orchids have been named because of their resemblance to bees, and other orchids have been similarly named because we humans see a likeness to other creatures, such as: Fly Orchid, Frog Orchid, Butterfly Orchid, Lizard Orchid, Monkey and Man Orchids. Most of these are rare plants, only growing in special and protected places. But if you are lucky enough to see any or all of them, you will see that the more common Bee Orchid is equally beautiful and amazing in its own special way, and to be equally treasured!

#### We will remember them ....

In the coming weeks, we commemorate the centenaries of the deaths on active service of several men honoured on memorials in our parishes:

**Driver Thomas Dennis** of the Army Service Corps died on 11 June 1916.

Thomas Dennis was born in 1889 in Wilsthorpe, the son of Thomas and Sarah Dennis. Thomas senior worked for the railway, and Thomas junior appears to have followed his father into working for the railway. He then enlisted in the army and served in the Army Service Corps – first in France (from July 1915) and subsequently with the British Expeditionary Force (BEF) in Mesopotamia (now Iraq and neighbouring countries), where he was attached to the 39th Field Ambulance. Thomas died on 11 June 1916 and is buried in Amara Cemetery, Iraq. The city of Amara had been occupied by the BEF in June 1915 and had become a major hospital centre – so Thomas was probably wounded in action but died of his wounds in one of the hospitals. Thomas was 27 years old when he died, and as a son of Wilsthorpe, is commemoratted on the War Memorial in St Faith's Church.

**Private George Decimus Neal** of the 7th Battalion Northamptonshire Regiment died on 22 June 1916.

George Decimus Neal was born in West Deeping in late 1893, the seventh child of Jeremiah and Fanny Neal. Jeremiah had been born in early 1853 in West Deeping, the son of Samuel Neal and Sarah Eldred. Samuel (an agricultural labourer) died in 1855, and in 1861 Jeremiah and his mother and her other two children were resident with Sarah's parents in West Deeping. In 1871 Jeremiah was an agricultural labourer, boarding in Stowe. He married Fanny Elizabeth Wells in 1878, and they appear to have spent their entire married life in West Deeping. They had 10 children (one of whom had died by 1911). George was at home with his parents at the time of the 1901 census, but in 1911 he was living at the Church Missionary, College in Islington and working as a foot boy. Jeremiah and Fanny continued to live in West Deeping until Jeremiah died in late 1939 aged 86 and Fanny died in late 1943 aged 85. Military Records show that George enlisted in the Northamptonshire Regiment in Peterborough and served in the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion - which was part of a Division within Kitchener's Third New Army. The Division moved to France in August 1915 and in September took part in the Battle of Loos, in which the 7<sup>th</sup> Northamptonshires lost more than 120 men. George joined the Battalion shortly after the Battle of Loos as one of the reinforcements posted in after the battle. The Battalion then took part in the localised actions in the area south of Ypres in the spring and early summer of 1916. It then suffered a phosgene gas attack by the Germans on 17 June - the attack was repulsed but some casualties were sustained. George was among those who died shortly after the attack - and as he is buried at Boulogne, one of the base ports where there was a major hospital complex, it seems likely that George was injured in the attack and evacuated to the hospital but died before he could be brought back to England. George was 23 when he died; as a son of West Deeping he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Andrew's Church, West Deeping.

#### We will Remember them Continued:

**Second Lieutenant Joseph Anstee** of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 1 July 1916.

Joseph Anstee was born in West Deeping in 1890 (and baptised on 25 May 1890 in St Andrew's Church). He was the youngest child of William and Mary Anstee. William was a miller and the family came to live at The Mill in West Deeping in the early 1880s. It appears that Joseph spent all his early life at the Mill, and by 1911 was assisting in the family milling business. Joseph enlisted in the army, and by the start of the Battle of the Somme he was serving as a Second Lieutenant in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment. The Battalion took part in the massive Anglo-French attack made on either side of the River Somme on 1 July 1916 involving five divisions of the French Sixth Army and eleven British divisions (each comprising approaching 20,000 men) of the British Fourth Army. It is generally considered to be most disastrous day in British military history, but the French forces had significant successes on both banks of the Somme, as did the British forces adjacent the French. But further north the British forces suffered an unprecedented number of casualties (including 19,240 men killed). Joseph Anstee and 127 other men of the 2<sup>nd</sup> second battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 1 July 1916; Joseph and 93 of his colleagues are commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial (ie they have no known grave). Joseph was 26 years old when he died; as a son of West Deeping he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Andrew's Church, West Deeping.

Driver Thomas Dennis will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at Wilsthorpe on Sunday  $5^{th}$  June.

Private George Neal will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at West Deeping on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> June.

Second Lieutenant Joseph Anstee will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at West Deeping on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> July.

Several more men from our parishes died later in July 1916 and they will be commemorated on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> July at the services in Greatford (Fred Garner and Harry Headland) and Tallington (William Gray) and on 17<sup>th</sup> July at the service in Barholm (John W Tomblin and George William Pickering) — their stories will appear in July's *Towers and Spires*.
