



#### Dear Friends,

I hope you will understand when I say that I have been really unsure as to what to write in this letter for August. A number of drafts have ended up 'on the floor'. How to write something that is appropriate for our times — when the times seem to be so fast moving? Every time I get some words down on paper, something big seems to happen in the world, the latest being the arrival of a new Prime Minister. In the face of such upheaval, what are we to do and to say?

Well, I am going to say in this letter what I have been saying to people as I have met them face to face over the past few weeks, and what I usually ask people in more normal times as well: 'How are you?' This is a genuine question. I really am interested in the answer. If we can do nothing else in a highly-charged, confusing, fast-moving context, in which emotions are all over the place and hopes and fears are clashing pretty equally, on different subjects, I can at least enquire about how people are feeling, and listen to them: 'How are you?'

People matter. Everyone. We are all God's children. We are all flesh and blood with feelings, aspirations and anxieties. My faith tells me this. My understanding and following of Jesus tells me this. So: 'How are you?' However you are, whatever you are feeling at this complicated time, please know that you are loved by God. Please also know that my fellow bishops and 1 are concerned for you and for the people who are on your heart.

Sometimes it is difficult to express this concern in ways that really connect — time is limited and 1 am all too aware of the people for whom 1 have care and for whom 1 don't think 1 have demonstrated that care in action very well. These people and situations become a matter for my prayer and my sorrow. But, in common with everyone, having made my confession 1 then need to return to the practical opportunities that 1 do have to put my care into action. So, during this complicated summer, know that you matter, and join with me, please, in putting care into action. And do feel free to reply to my question, if you choose!

May God bless you, and may you have a very good August.

# Bishop Nicholas

## Dear Friends,

Anyone who's visited the Rectory will know that I'm not exactly domestically inclined. I do try to keep things clean, but tidy doesn't usually make it - especially not with the number of books and pieces of paper I've always got around. When it comes down to it, I always seem to have other things to do with my time. Until something happens and my priorities change, and I miraculously find the time to do some sorting. What causes the miracle? Expecting visitors, usually – having friends or family to stay. It's wonderful to see them, but I know I need to do some organizing before they arrive.

It's amazing how a bit of motivation can create time and energy where we thought they didn't exist. It's the same when it comes to our spiritual life. Among the things we talk and learn about in preparing for confirmation are the Bible and prayer, and confirmation candidates always seem to have the motivation to make the time for reading the Bible and for daily prayer - which is wonderful. In one sense, it isn't that hard - even five or ten minutes with the Bible each day adds up terrifically over a year; saying grace before a meal or asking God for help takes only seconds, even if listening to God for an answer to prayer takes a bit longer. And yet, once the enthusiasm has, if not disappeared, then at least died down a bit, finding time for God on a daily basis can become something of a struggle, especially amid the other struggles of daily life, home and work and family hands up everyone who's already looking forward to the start of the new school term...

Over 70 years ago, in the Screwtape Letters, CS Lewis wrote about the problem of finding time - and many other things - and they're still well worth reading. The Letters are from a senior devil, Screwtape, to his nephew Wormwood, out on tempting duty when his 'patient' becomes a Christian, and they run through many of the pitfalls of life and faith - the ones that we'd rather avoid but that Screwtape, of course, is encouraging.

Lewis suggests taking a different attitude to time. He says that our basic problem is possessiveness - we think our time is our own, and we part with it grudgingly or willingly, depending on how we're spending it. But as he points out, we don't create a single moment of time - it comes from God. So why don't we treat it as God's time, and use it to do what God wants? That leaves us much better off - because what God wants is not just us rushing round, doing what has to be done, but also us spending time with God, and spending time on ourselves, for rest and recreation. And perhaps the shift in perspective, spending someone else's time, not our own, will give us the motivation to use time wisely.

Minutes of the specially convened meeting held on Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2016 was also approved and signed: Pro: Cllr. Sheehan Sec. Cllr. Dodsworth.

#### Declarations Of Interest

Cllr. Babbs, Cllr. K. Genever and Cllr. P. Genever would declare an interest when the boundary fence between Mr. Navid's property and the play area was discussed.

## **Matters Arising**

**Play area** – The bin will be emptied and roll of bin liner will be put at the bottom of the bin so that a new liner is available at all times.

Cllr. Mulvaney reported that she had received offers from more volunteers to burn in the sponsors name on the palings.

#### Freedom of Information – Request for information regarding highways budgets.

The Parish Council had had a reply regarding the above and all the information supplied will be put on the Uffington Web site.

#### **Newstead Corner**

Nothing further had been heard regarding clearing the grips on Uffington Hill. It was reported that the 7.5 ton sign had been replaced at Newstead Corner but not the lamp post.

## Street Lighting Transformation Project

The Parish Council had been notified that the times when some of the street lights will be turned off has been changed to midnight (rather than 10pm) to 6am

# Wheelie Bin 30 mph warning Stickers

These stickers are available to be stuck on wheelie bins warning motorists that they are in a 30 mph limit area. They are not to be left out indefinitely, only on the days the bins are put out for collection. They may be purchased from the Clerk at 50P each.

# Correspondence

An e mail had been received from Mr. M. Meadows regarding the state of the Greatford Road and the large puddles that congregate after heavy rain. Highways to be informed again.

He had also complained to the Clerk regarding a football net on the balancing lagoon. As this area belongs to SKDC they are to be contacted.

AON Insurance had sent to the Parish Council their Certificate of Employer's Liability Insurance. LCC had sent information regarding Lincolnshire Central Heating Fund scheme. This to be put on the web site.

An e mail has been received from LCC stating that a works order has been raised for the grass to be cut on Footpath 917 north of the school playing field.

A letter has been received from Nick Boles MP replying to our enquiry as to who paid for the Police Commissioners election. Apparently this comes out of the police budget. He also stated that he had contacted Cllr. Martin Hill Leader of LCC raising our concerns!!!

It was decided at the VH Meeting that rather than paying the Council more money, it be written into the hall hiring contract for the hirer to take their rubbish home.

LCC to be asked to spray off the weeds in the verges and kerbs in and around the village and on Newstead corner.

Complaints had also been received regarding the state of the pull-in on Essendine Road, LCC to be informed. Cllr. P. Genever stated that if the Council would deliver him some road planeings he would be willing to go and spread them in the pull-in to make them usable.

Queen's 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebrations in Uffington had been well attended and in fact oversubscribed. A letter of thanks be sent to Vanessa and Nick Kimberly and their team for all their efforts in making the event such a success.

Cllr. M. Trollope-Bellew reported:

- The Post Office would remain on Ryhall Road and not be moving to Morrisions
- LCC had purchased a large gritter "The Beast" that would hold more salt and be able to spread more in one go.
- The LCC Civic Service would be held in Uffington Church on 11<sup>th</sup> September. 2016 Cllr. R. Woolley reported that SKDC had agreed to go in for the next stage of the Devolution Project.

# We will remember them ....

In July, we marked the centenaries of the deaths on active service of six men honoured on First World War memorials in our parishes:

**Second Lieutenant Joseph Anstee** of the 2nd Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died in the opening phase of the Battle of the Somme on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1916 (aged 26). A summary of his story appeared in June's Towers & Spires. He was remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at West Deeping on Sunday 3rd July.

Private Fred Garner of the 1st/4th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 1916. Fred was born in Dunsby in 1893 – the second child of William and Annie Garner. By 1901 the family (now including five children) had moved to Stowe Road, Greatford and William was a horse keeper on farm. The 1911 census described both William and Fred as waggoner on farm, and a younger brother was a yardboy on farm. By the time the war started Fred was working in Waternewton as a horseman. Fred enlisted in the Lincolnshire Regiment in Stamford in May 1915 and served in the 1st/4th Battalion (a territorial, ie volunteer, unit). That Battalion had originally landed in France in March 1915 engaging in a number of actions which cost the lives of a small number of its men. But in October 1915 150 men of the Battalion died in a major action at the Hohenzollern Redoubt. Fred Garner joined the Battalion shortly afterwards among the replacements for the lost men. The Battalion was then posted briefly to Egypt but returned to France in early 1916. On the first day of the Battle of the Somme (1 July 1916) the Battalion took part in a diversionary attack on Gommecourt to the north of the main Somme assault. Fred Garner was evidently injured during that action, and evacuated to a casualty clearing station 10 miles behind the front line, but died there as a result of his wounds on  $2^{nd}$  July. He is buried at Warlincourt Halte British Cemetery adjacent the casualty clearing station. Fred died three days after his 23<sup>rd</sup> birthday; he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Thomas Becket Church, Greatford and was remembered during the 9am service there on 10<sup>th</sup> July.

**Private Harry Headland** of the 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion Bedfordshire Regiment died on 9<sup>th</sup> July 1916. Harry was born in Hoby (near Melton Mowbray) in 1887 to John and Ada Headland (the first of their six children), but by the 1890s the family had moved to Main Street, Greatford. By 1911 John and Ada and some of their children lived in Stamford Road, Barholm, while Harry was living at Aunby Lodge working as a Horseman on Farm. But by the start of the war Harry was working alongside his friend Fred Garner on the same farm at Waternewton. Harry then enlisted in the army in Bedford, and served initially in the 8th Battalion of the Bedfordshire Regiment. The Battalion embarked for France in August 1915 and Harry is recorded as landing in France on 30 August 1915, but the Battalion was not involved immediately in any major actions. By the spring of 1916 Harry had transferred to the 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Bedfordshire Regiment which saw action around Arras in May and June. Then on 9/10 July 1916, the Battalion went into action in the on-going Battle of the Somme, resulting the death of over 100 men of the Battalion. Harry was one of those killed on 9<sup>th</sup> July – the Stamford and Rutland News of 26 July 1916 reported that "Writing to Private Headland's sister, a comrade states that an explosive shell burst a few yards above his friend's head and, although he was wearing a steel helmet, two pieces of shrapnel penetrated his head with fatal results. He was buried the same evening and now lies in a soldier's grave." The location of that grave was lost in subsequent fighting, and like many of his comrades who fell at that time, Harry is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial – one of the 72192 British and Commonwealth soldiers who died in the Somme sector who have no known grave, (though his body may be in one of the many graves in the Somme area bearing the inscription A soldier of the Great War known unto God). Harry was 29 years old when he died; and having spent much of his life in Greatford is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Thomas Becket Church and was remembered during the 9am service there on 10<sup>th</sup> July.

Lance Corporal John William Tomblin of the  $7^{th}$  Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on  $12^{th}$  July 1916. John was born in Barholm in 1893, the oldest child (of four) of Thomas and Elizabeth Tomblin. Thomas had married Elizabeth Ann Dance in late 1889. Thomas and Elizabeth started their married life in Southorpe and then moved to Barholm — Thomas worked on the land, as a labourer or nurseryman at various times. The 1911 census shows that John was living in Barholm with his parents and brother Francis; John was a domestic gardener; his father and brother

Francis were estate labourers. John enlisted in Grantham and served in the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment which went to the Western Front in July 1915 (John arriving there on 31 July 1915) serving to the south of Ypres for the rest of 1915 and the early part of 1916. During this period John's younger brother, Francis, who had enlisted in the 8<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment arrived in France on 10 September and then took part in Battle of Loos; the 8<sup>th</sup> Lincolnshires suffered very high casualties and Francis was recorded as killed in action – his body was never identified. In spring 1916, John was posted with the 7<sup>th</sup> Lincolnshires to France, where they took part in the Battle of Albert on the opening day of the Battle of the Somme; the 7<sup>th</sup> Lincolnshires helped capture Fricourt on 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> July, albeit at the immediate cost of the lives of 50 of its men. About a dozen more men died during the next fortnight at increasing distances from the front line as the wounded were evacuated through the casualty clearing system. John was brought back to a hospital in England, after one leg had been amputated in France, but he died of his wounds on 12 July. John was 23 years old when he died. His body was brought to Barholm and he was buried in the Churchyard there; and he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Martin's Church, Barholm. He was remembered during the 9am service on 17<sup>th</sup> July.

Private William Robert ("Bob") Gray was born in Tallington in 1891, the sixth child of John and Harriet Gray, John was the publican of the Crooked Billet Inn on Bainton Road and later of the Tennyson's Arms. Bob worked first for Blackstones in Stamford, but by 1911 had left Tallington and by the start of the War was resident in Willesden, Middlesex, working in a garage. Bob enlisted in the army in Mill Hill in April 1915 and served in the 1st Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment. The Battalion had been among the first units of the British Expeditionary Force in France and took part in several of the major actions of the first year of the war (during which just over 100 men died in action), and then on 25th September 1915 another 148 men died in the carnage of the first day of the Battle of Loos. Bob's military record shows he joined the Battalion in France on 27th September. For the next nine months the Battalion was involved in a variety of minor actions on the Western Front in France. But on 15 July 1916 the Battalion was thrown into action in the Battle of Bazentin Ridge – part of the on-going Battle of the Somme. During the four day battle, British and allied forces succeeded in pushing back the German army; but casualty levels were high. Bob was reported as missing during that action. His body was never found and he is listed as one of the 96 men of 1st Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment killed in action on 15th July. Eighty one of these men, including Bob, have no known grave and are commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial. Bob was 24 years old when he died, and as a son of Tallington, he is commemorated on the war memorial in St Lawrence Church, Tallington, and was remembered during the evening service on 10 July.

Private George William Pickering of the 1st Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 25th July 1916. George had been born in Barholm in spring 1890, the third child of John and Sarah Pickering; John and Sarah had married in the spring of 1886, and they appear to have spent the rest of their married lives in Barholm. John was a farmworker (and in the 1901 and 1911 censuses was described as horsekeeper on farm). George followed his father into farmwork and then enlisted in the Lincolnshire Regiment in Stamford, and served in the 1st Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment. The 1st Lincolnshires was part the original British Expeditionary Force that went to France at the start of the war, and George's medal card shows that he disembarked on 13 August 1914. His Battalion then took part in most of the major actions in the early months of the war including the battles of Mons, the Marne, Le Cateau, the Aisne, La Bassee and Messines, and the First Battle of Ypres in the Autumn of 1914 and then the Winter Operations 1914-15 (during which time nearly 400 of its men died in battle). After a short break the Battalion took part in the second Battle of Ypres in spring 1915 and played a small part in the Battle of Loos in the autumn of 1915. The Battalion was then transferred to the newly formed Kitchener Third Army which had first seen action in the Battle of Loos when it lost huge numbers of men. With these new comrades the Battalion spent the spring of 1916 on the Western Front in France and then took part in the Battle of Albert in the opening stages of the Battle of the Somme; 77 of its men were killed in this action and a further 12 men died in the following few weeks, being buried increasing distances from the front line (following the usual pattern of the wounded being evacuated from the front line). George Pickering was among those who died during this period, and one of a handful who died of his wounds after being brought back to England. George was 26 years old when he died; he was buried in the churchyard in Barholm, and is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Martin's Church. He was remembered during the 9am service in Barholm on 17<sup>th</sup> July.

He has certainly been an inspiration to our Group during his time with us.

On Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> June — Diana and Peter Holden kindly opened their beautiful garden in Wilsthorpe in aid of Age UK and the Wilsthorpe Steeple Appeal. Not only did visitors wander around the beautiful garden to admire a striking array of plants and water features, they also enjoyed plenty of Pimms and snacks! There was also tombola and plant stalls and the event raised approximately £300 which was split equally between the two worthy causes. Thank you Diana and Peter.



# **BARHOLM & STOWE**

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

A defibrillator has been placed inside a cabinet (registered with EMAS NHS Trust) on the outside of the barn at Vine Cottage opposite the 5 Horseshoes, Barholm.

The machine is simple & safe to use and gives clear spoken instructions. Once in position, the defibrillator detects the heart's rhythm. It won't deliver a shock unless one is needed. After a cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent.

First <u>call 999</u>, the operator can tell you if there's a public access defibrillator nearby and its <u>code number/key</u>. Don't delay or interrupt chest compressions to get it, send someone else.

Remember that you must call 999 first to obtain instructions on how to access the machine.

I would like to give a large vote of thanks to all who helped me raise money towards the purchase of this equipment, let's hope that it is never used. Rosemary

### SOMES TRUST STUDENT BURSARY SCHEME 2016

One of the main purposes of the Somes Trust is to promote the education of young people who are either resident in Uffington or who have attended Uffington School.

The Trustees are concerned that, with grants being replaced by loans and contributions being required for tuition fees, life has become much tougher for students embarking on higher education.

The Trustees want to help ensure that the young people of Uffington get as much as possible from their higher education and have therefore decided to again run a Bursary Scheme for young people under the age of 23 embarking on higher education for the first time.

The Bursaries will be discretionary one-off payments and are intended to help cover some of the initial costs of further education such as textbooks, equipment and deposits on accommodation. The size of these awards will depend on the number of successful applicants and the merits of the individual cases, but will not be less than £100.

Applications are invited from people under the age of 23 who are entering higher education for the first time in 2016.

To be eligible you must either be resident in the Parish of Uffington, or must have attended Uffington C of E Controlled Primary School. If you want to apply please write to:- The Trustees of the Somes Trust, The Homestead, Greatford Road, Uffington.

In your application please state which course you will be doing, which educational establishment you will be attending and what date you start. Please also say if your course is full or part time and whether or not you will be living away from home. The Trustees will need to have details of why the money is needed and what you intend to spend it on.

Applications must be received before October 1st 2016. Successful candidates will be notified before 1<sup>st</sup> November 2016.
