



Hello All Regular Subscribers,

Unfortunately, we have arrived at a situation that, without your assistance, could be the death knell of T&S. Following two increases in the cost of paper this year, our Printers are, from January 2017, increasing our monthly cost to a level that is beyond our present income.

After pondering on this for some time, we believe that the easiest way that we can reduce our printing cost is to reduce the present size of the T&S, but in doing so we need the active cooperation of all of our subscribers.

From January 2017 we will have to reduce the number of pages in T&S to 28. To maintain a sufficient advertising income to pay the Printer (without inordinately increasing our advertisers' charges - thereby losing them, our sole source of income!) we must immediately set aside 16 of those pages. So folks, there will be only 12 pages for village reports etc. As there are 7 villages in our parish, an allocation of 1 page per village seems fair with the remaining 5 given over to the Clergy (normally occupying circa 3 pages) and, thereafter, the inclusion of village events that cannot be adequately included within the allocated village page. In doing this there will need to be a degree of give and take between villages because we that look after T&S do not want to be embroiled in policing and arbitration!

Accordingly, we ask that you be most circumspect in the input that you provide for publication. For instance, do we really need information in the body of a T&S article when it is additionally included in the centre-fold calendar? If the full minutes of village meetings can be found on-line, on a notice-board or wherever, is there a need for them to be repeated verbatim in T&S when perhaps some expurgated highlights and a reference to a web page/notice-board might suffice? Do so many items have to be boxed and half/full page rather than just a single line of text in the village entry? All of the foregoing consumes inordinate space.

Up to now there has been no charge to advertise Village events or those held in our Village Halls-many of which make an income, however small that might be. However, faced with the aforementioned financial situation, we now must consider the introduction of a small fee to advertise all fund raising or 'paid for' events. We have yet to finalise the level of these potential fees but they are unlikely to add more than a few pence to the cost paid by each of those attending such events. In our view, such costs could be easily added to any price charged for entry/attendance at the event in the first instance.

Despite previously asking for some conformity in the texts provided, from Jan 2017 the new aim is for Village subscribers to 'shoe-horn' their inputs onto a single A5 page by using the MS Word provided narrow margins format and adjusting the font size, font condensing and line spacing accordingly. You might be surprised just how much you can get into a single A5 page with some judicious massaging. I am prepared to guide inexperienced users through the appropriate niceties of MS Word. If help is needed please email the document to me, have your copy on your screen in MS Word and ring me. I will talk you though how to make it smaller while retaining its readability.

It's not easy to be told you've developed a condition that's going to be with you for life — but it happens to a lot of us. An illness or accident can change life completely or to some extent, and the changes can seem like a mountain to climb. Mostly, the people around us are supportive, but they don't necessarily understand, and often try to cheer us up by telling us that we're going to be able to cope — but that doesn't always help much. That's because it misses out an important stage in coming to terms with things: we need to let ourselves grieve first.

Let ourselves grieve. Its something we're not always very good at doing. We're getting a bit better at grieving a death, particularly of a family member, as shown by the growing popularity of the All Souls' and Remembrance services. Even then, tho', we often think our grieving should be over fairly quickly, with 'normal life' resuming after just a few weeks. But that's just not realistic. I don't really want to see everyone going around in black or grey, times have changed too much, but actually that old-fashioned habit of going into mourning, and letting everyone know that you were still needing space to grieve, wasn't all bad, and the timescale was pretty realistic – you were expected to be in mourning for a year for a parent, up to two for a partner.

But grieving isn't only about death. When we have a major change in our life circumstances, including – perhaps especially – our health, we need to grieve the loss of what is gone. We can learn to cope with long-tem health conditions – of course we can. We can keep going, learn to do things differently, get used to taking tablets, doing exercises, giving ourselves injections – life can still be very good. But we must have the chance to grieve for the loss of the life we knew, the old way of doing things, because it's only when we grieve the loss and accept the change in our lives that we can move on to coping and being positive and discovering the riches of the new way of life we've been forced to develop.

It's important to ask for help when we need it. Talking to others who've been through the same thing can be very helpful, which is why support groups for a particular thing are so useful, and well worth tracking down. And the church can help, too. It's somewhere else to talk things through, of course; there are people who can offer support in prayer, publicly or privately; and there are services of wholeness and healing specifically designed to help us to cope with life and support us through the difficulties. I've written about these services before – just contact me if you'd like more information – and there will be one at the end of this month, in Uffington Church at 6pm on Sunday 27th November. All are welcome – especially, perhaps, if you find this a difficult time of year, and would like some extra help to get you through Christmas. It's a quiet service which can feel very special. And if you can't make it to church, let me know – I can come to you.




