



A VIEW FROM THE CURATE'S HOUSE

Almost 70 years ago, a life long disciple of Jesus Christ said this in a radio address: - "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong. But I shall not have the strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my yow, and bless all of you who are willing to share it."

l suppose you can easily guess who said those words? It was, of course, the Queen whose 90th birthday we continue to celebrate this month with various events in our villages and churches. She said those words sixty-nine years ago, on the occasion of her 21st birthday, when she was, in effect, coming of age as an adult, a princess and as the heir to the throne. The Queen is our sovereign and is also the head of the Church of England, but she is not simply a figurehead. She is an active Christian disciple who is sustained in her role by her deep faith: a deep faith that she is happy to share with others. Her Christian love is demonstrated by her love of her family, her love of all the varied communities across the United Kingdom and of the diverse communities that make up the Commonwealth.

Over the last few weeks a number of people from our seven churches have been attending the Developing Discipleship Programme meetings. The programme is designed to help us start thinking about how we can better serve God and our wider communities as disciples of Christ. We have already met to think about our vocation and our values and there will be another meeting at 7pm on 22nd June in Greatford Village Hall to develop a vision for the Uffington Group as a whole. We are called as Christians to serve our communities. Christ is the best example of how to serve, but we can also look for guidance to the example of our Queen's loving service to our country and the Commonwealth. She is a true disciple of Christ.

As we celebrate the life of our Queen, let us also celebrate the common life of all our villages. Let us rejoice in the community spirit that draws us all together to mark great occasions such as this one and let us continue to actively care for one another as Christ teaches us.

As I close this letter, I would like to take the opportunity to let you know that I have been appointed to the post of Rector of Quarrington with Old Sleaford. This means that I will probably be leaving the Uffington Group when my contract terminates at the end of June. While I am looking forward to my new role in Quarrington, I will be leaving with a feeling of sadness as I have greatly enjoyed serving you all. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your love and support over the last 14 months.



Thomas Dennis WW1 soldier remembered on the 11th June

Thomas Dennis was born at the Gatehouse, Wilsthorpe in 1889. His mother was Sarah and his father, who was a plate layer on the railway, was also called Thomas. Thomas was baptised at St Faith's church on the 21st of May 1889 and spent his childhood in Wilsthorpe, being shown on the 1901 census as a Scholar. At the outbreak of WWI Thomas, a signalman on the railway, joined the Royal Army Medical Corps and was attached to the 39th Field Ambulance as a driver. Thomas was wounded and gassed in France. After recovering he joined the Persian Gulf Expedition and died of disease at Basra on the 11th June 1916 aged 27 years. He is buried at the Amara War Cemetery in Iraq.

At a parish meeting held in Wilsthorpe on the 5^{th} April 1920, a vote of thanks was accorded to Mr Warth of Wilsthorpe for so generously presenting a memorial tablet for the church in honour of the one solider from Wilsthorpe who lost his life in the war.

The inscription reads -

Went the day well He died and never knew But well or ill England, he died for you

Gillian Johns congratulated the branch on its entry in the recent Uffington Scarecrow Weekend, and thanked Sheila Croft, Pauline Earley, Lynda Glover and Maggie Carter for their hard work. The Wi's annual cake stall, always a popular feature of the event, raised £305. Treasurer Carole Chapman reported that funds were looking healthy and the previous month's sales table had raised £42. The speaker was medical herbalist Ginny Kemp from the Herb Clinic, With a degree in medical science and wide experience in herbal medicine, she sees patients from all areas surrounding Stamford at the town's Broad Street Practice. Modern herbal medicine combines the long-recognised qualities of plants with current research and practice, says Ginny. We face challenges today that include stress, drug resistance and side effects, pollution and other afflictions of modern lifestyles. Unsurprisingly, the benefits of medicine in its most natural form are being re-discovered and the low risk of side-effects is being increasingly acknowledged and appreciated.' Members were fascinated by the tincture samples of medicinal plants, including camomile, echinacea, cinnamon and meadowsweet, she brought along, and by her talk on their uses. 

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Parish Council Meeting took place on Monday 9^{TH} May at St Faith's Church, Wilsthorpe.

It was proposed that Cllr Dave Kentish be elected as Chairman with Cllr Paul Morriss as Vice-Chairman.

It was reported that the majority of the potholes around the parish had been marked with white paint ready for repair but the damaged verge opposite Holland House had yet to be dealt with. The Clerk reported that she had received no response relating to the hire of a reactive speed sign.

The Clerk reported that the Annual Insurance had decreased from the previous year by £9.80.

Councillors asked the District Councillor to 'call in' the planning application from Mr Bremner for variation of conditions to previous application if the Officer recommends refusal. The application would then go before the Planning Committee at the District Council. Work was allowed for the removal of one elder and prune an apple tree at 12 Main Street, Braceborough.

It was reported that Lorries had again damaged the verge by the side of The Elms at Quincey's Lane. If anyone sees an incident please take the vehicle registration number, time & date and report to either the clerk or Parish Councillor. The Clerk was asked to report street light 6, Church Lane. Fly tipping and litter were again a concern of residents.

Cllr Kentish reported that he had attended a Neighbourhood Police Panel Meeting and said that speeding and poor parking continued to be a major problem in villages but the crime rate was low.



GARDENING & WILDLIFE IN JUNE

The twittering, trilling, whistling and musical calls of a flock of Goldfinches are very distinctive. The birds' plumage is attractive too — with the broad yellow panels on their wings (which show up in flight and also when the wings are closed) and the bold black, white and red markings on their heads (black cap, and red patch around the beaks) contrasting with their tawny and chestnut coloured feathers on their backs and chests. But the combination of their musical calls and colourful feathers made them attractive to the Victorians as cage birds.

As a result, thousands of these little birds were trapped and caught, and their numbers plummeted. However, the newly-formed Society for the Protection of Birds (which later became the RSPB) made the recovery of the Goldfinch a priority for their work. The birds' numbers increased and over the years the population has recovered. Various mechanisms and incentives have been used to help their recovery. In addition, feeding the birds in winter with a variety of bird food has helped the Goldfinch (and other similar birds) survive the cold months. Goldfinches particularly love small black nyger seeds.

During the summer and autumn months, they seek out seeds on thistles and teasels, and they also feed on seeds from trees such as Alder and Birch. If you have space, can you consider leaving a small area of the garden a bit untidy and plant a teasel or allow a thistle to grow and provide some seed for Goldfinches? They will reward you with their songs and calls, and sight of their colourful feathers of red and yellow and black! And you will see why a flock of Goldfinches is called a charm! **Donna Radley & Tim Barfield**



We will remember them

In the coming weeks, we commemorate the centenaries of the deaths on active service of several men honoured on memorials in our parishes:

Driver Thomas Dennis of the Army Service Corps died on 11 June 1916.

Thomas Dennis was born in 1889 in Wilsthorpe, the son of Thomas and Sarah Dennis. Thomas senior worked for the railway, and Thomas junior appears to have followed his father into working for the railway. He then enlisted in the army and served in the Army Service Corps – first in France (from July 1915) and subsequently with the British Expeditionary Force (BEF) in Mesopotamia (now Iraq and neighbouring countries), where he was attached to the 39th Field Ambulance. Thomas died on 11 June 1916 and is buried in Amara Cemetery, Iraq. The city of Amara had been occupied by the BEF in June 1915 and had become a major hospital centre – so Thomas was probably wounded in action but died of his wounds in one of the hospitals. Thomas was 27 years old when he died, and as a son of Wilsthorpe, is commemoratted on the War Memorial in St Faith's Church.

Private George Decimus Neal of the 7th Battalion Northamptonshire Regiment died on 22 June 1916

George Decimus Neal was born in West Deeping in late 1893, the seventh child of leremiah and Fanny Neal. Jeremiah had been born in early 1853 in West Deeping, the son of Samuel Neal and Sarah Eldred. Samuel (an agricultural labourer) died in 1855, and in 1861 leremiah and his mother and her other two children were resident with Sarah's parents in West Deeping. In 1871 Jeremiah was an agricultural labourer, boarding in Stowe. He married Fanny Elizabeth Wells in 1878, and they appear to have spent their entire married life in West Deeping. They had 10 children (one of whom had died by 1911). George was at home with his parents at the time of the 1901 census, but in 1911 he was living at the Church Missionary, College in Islington and working as a foot boy. Jeremiah and Fanny continued to live in West Deeping until Jeremiah died in late 1939 aged 86 and Fanny died in late 1943 aged 85. Military Records show that George enlisted in the Northamptonshire Regiment in Peterborough and served in the 7th Battalion – which was part of a Division within Kitchener's Third New Army. The Division moved to France in August 1915 and in September took part in the Battle of Loos, in which the 7th Northamptonshires lost more than 120 men. George joined the Battalion shortly after the Battle of Loos as one of the reinforcements posted in after the battle. The Battalion then took part in the localised actions in the area south of Ypres in the spring and early summer of 1916. It then suffered a phosgene gas attack by the Germans on 17 June - the attack was repulsed but some casualties were sustained. George was among those who died shortly after the attack - and as he is buried at Boulogne, one of the base ports where there was a major hospital complex, it seems likely that George was injured in the attack and evacuated to the hospital but died before he could be brought back to England. George was 23 when he died; as a son of West Deeping he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Andrew's Church, West Deeping.

Continued Elsewhere:

We will remember them continued:

Second Lieutenant Joseph Anstee of the 2nd Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 1 July 1916.

loseph Anstee was born in West Deeping in 1890 (and baptised on 25 May 1890 in St Andrew's Church). He was the youngest child of William and Mary Anstee. William was a miller and the family came to live at The Mill in West Deeping in the early 1880s. It appears that loseph spent all his early life at the Mill, and by 1911 was assisting in the family milling business. Joseph enlisted in the army, and by the start of the Battle of the Somme he was serving as a Second Lieutenant in the 2nd Battalion of the Lincolnshire Regiment. The Battalion took part in the massive Anglo-French attack made on either side of the River Somme on 1 July 1916 involving five divisions of the French Sixth Army and eleven British divisions (each comprising approaching 20,000 men) of the British Fourth Army. It is generally considered to be most disastrous day in British military history. but the French forces had significant successes on both banks of the Somme, as did the British forces adjacent the French. But further north the British forces suffered an unprecedented number of casualties (including 19,240 men killed). Joseph Anstee and 127 other men of the 2nd second battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 1 July 1916; Joseph and 93 of his colleagues are commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial (ie they have no known grave). Joseph was 26 years old when he died; as a son of West Deeping he is commemorated on the War Memorial in St Andrew's Church, West Deeping.

Driver Thomas Dennis will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at Wilsthorpe on Sunday 5th June.

Private George Neal will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at West Deeping on Sunday 19th June.

Second Lieutenant Joseph Anstee will be remembered at a ceremony during the 10:30am service at West Deeping on Sunday 3rd July.

Several more men from our parishes died later in July 1916 and they will be commemorated on Sunday 10th July at the services in Greatford (Fred Garner and Harry Headland) and Tallington (William Gray) and on 17th July at the service in Barholm (John W Tomblin and George William Pickering) – their stories will appear in July's *Towers and Spires*.
