

WILDLIFE & GARDENING IN JANUARY

January is the month for New Year resolutions, and we have a suggestion that you might like to consider....

The Times newspaper had 4 charities benefitting from their 2015 Christmas Appeal, and one of them was the British Hedgehog Preservation Society. The hedgehog – "a ubiquitous snuffling presence in British gardens" appearing in heraldry, Shakespeare and Beatrix Potter – is no longer common or found everywhere. It has been estimated that there were about 30 million hedgehogs in the UK in 1950, but that number has plummeted to about a million now, and certainly dropped by a half, or possibly two thirds, since 2000.

No-one is quite sure why we have lost so many. It could be due to road kill, but also to loss of habitat, particularly of hedgerows. One of the consequences of losing ideal habitat, and habitat that joins up, is that populations of hedgehogs become separated and isolated, leading to in-breeding, and being vulnerable to local destructive factors — they just have nowhere to go. But we can help! And this is where a New Year Resolution comes in – how about us trying to look after our local hedgehogs? We can all do things in our garden that can help, such as:

- Cutting small holes in the bottom of fences to allow hedgehogs to easily roam between gardens;
- Keep rotting logs by the compost to provide beetles for them to eat;
- Mow the grass or areas of the lawn less often, and provide scrubby areas, hedgerows, fallen leaves for cover and foraging;
- Ensure that your pond has at least one area where a hedgehog can climb out –
 they can't get out of a pond with vertical sides and will just drown and provide
 a slope or steps or rocks that they can use;
- Provide logs or ramps in the bottom of cattle grids so that hedgehogs can escape.
- Good habitat for hedgehogs is great for other wildlife too and hedgehogs are great friends of gardeners, as they LOVE eating snails and slugs!

8th January - Barnack and Southorpe - A short walk through the Hills and Holes, Behind Walcot Hall and back via Southorpe. Suggest parking on Whitman Close (opposite the Hills and Holes), off Walcot Road). Approx 3.75 miles.

Friday 5th February - **Pit Lane** - **Ketton (Stamford Book)** - A walk around the outskirts of Ketton. Park at the top of Pit Lane near the scout hut. Approx 4 miles
