



WILDLIFE & GARDENING IN MARCH

March is a good month to spot two birds that are quite difficult to see at other times of the year. These are the Nuthatch and Treecreeper. They are both birds of woodland, parks, churchyards, orchards and gardens.

Male Nuthatches give their presence away by their spring calls and songs, which include squeaks, trills, twitters and even the occasional wolf-whistle! Once spotted, they are striking to see with their grey backs, orange-cream-chestnut underparts and a black band across the eyes, likened to a highwayman's mask!

They search for insects in and under the bark of trees, and can also feed on nut bags at the bird table, and sometimes hop about on grass looking for insects. They are unique in Britain, as the only bird species that can run down as well as up tree trunks, and are constantly busy in the branches and on tree trunks looking for food. Their long beaks are good at prising away bits of bark, and also opening, or hammering at, nuts and seeds — this gave rise to their traditional name of 'nut-hack'.

Treecreepers are very difficult to see because of their flecked and striped black, brown and cream upper feathers that camouflage them so well against tree trunks. They are small, and when busily hunting for insects and spiders under the bark of trees, they look like little mice running up the tree trunks. But when there are no leaves on the trees, they can be seen clinging on close to tree trunks and branches, running in a spiral fashion up the trees in short, jerky movements. They have long, downward-curving bills, likened to tweezers or a dentist's probe, and which are very efficient at finding their food.

Treecreepers spend most of their time on or in trees, feeding on invertebrates under the bark, nesting behind bark flaps, and sleep in hollows in the bark. They particularly love the spongy thick bark of Wellingtonia conifers in which they hollow out depressions for roosting and resting in, and which must be particularly warm and sheltered! **Donna Radley and Tim Barfield**

Dear All

This year Holy Week falls at the end of March, with Easter on the 27th. Mothering Sunday is on the 6th, with an informal service at Tallington at 10.30am, when we'll bless bunches of flowers for the children to give out, then Palm Sunday is on the 20th - why not come along for the blessing of the palms and the reading of the Passion story at the services that day.

There's plenty going on in Holy Week across the group, too, with at least one service every day, so that you can follow the story right the way through the week and walk the way of the cross. On Monday and Tuesday evenings there will be communion services at 7.30pm - Monday at Greatford, Tuesday at Uffington - and on Wednesday there will be a communion service at 10am at West Deeping. On Thursday evening there will be a commemoration of the Last Supper starting in Braceborough village hall and moving on to the church - see the separate notice for details. This is a great opportunity for fellowship as well as a chance to learn about the first Holy Week, and well worth coming to.

Good Friday is going to follow the same pattern as usual. The church services will take place as usual, in West Deeping at IIam and Uffington at 2pm, and once again some of us will be walking (on footpaths, not the road) from one church to the other, with a pause in Tallington on the way. You can come to just the services, just the walk, or join us for part of the route - check the posters at each church for exact timings, and let's hope that the weather stays fine... There'll also be our usual evening service at Barholm at 7pm. If you want to make something, you can come and build an Easter garden at Uffington at 3pm after the service, and enjoy a hot cross bun.

Easter Day will be full of services - not only will there be a communion service in each church, as usual, but we're going to start the day with an Easter Vigil and the lighting of the new fire, otherwise known as a dawn service. The good news this year is that, as the clocks change on Easter Day, the service is later than usual — not until 6am... That's when we'll gather in the dark to read Bible stories by torchlight, as we wait to celebrate the discovery made at break of day, when the women went to the tomb and found that Christ had risen. As a sign of the light of the risen Christ coming into the world, we'll light first one and then another six Easter candles, and take them on to the parishes for the communion services later in the day. Why not stagger out of bed and really know you're celebrating Easter – and don't forget to bring bells/jangling keys/anything else that makes a joyful noise, for use during the service.

Please come and join in on Easter Day and during the preparation for it, as we experience the richness of the Christian story and celebrate the new life God gives us in Christ.

SUPERFAST BROADBAND ARRIVES IN TALLINGTON



BT Openreach have finished installing our new green cabinet on Bainton Road (opposite Church Lane) and it is up and running. Speeds of up to 58Mbps down and 25Mbps up are available depending upon the broadband supplier and your distance from the green cabinet. Everyone in the village should see a significant improvement over the previous speeds of 3Mbps down and 0.2Mbps up. All Tallington residents can contact their current internet service provider (ISP) and request an upgrade to the superfast fibre broadband service. You are not obliged to stay with your current ISP, nor do you have to sign up to BT's Infinity service. You can keep your telephone line with BT and choose another company for your broadband. Everyone is free to shop around for the best deal (subject to their current contract).

Usually, the readings for communion services are the NT and Gospel, and for Morning or Evening Prayer the Psalm, OT and NT, but in Eastertide the reading from Acts is compulsory, so at all our services from Easter onwards we will read Acts and the Gospel.

The colour in church is purple (or blue) until Palm Sunday, which is red—and, of course, there are no flowers in church in Lent. Maundy Thursday is white, on Good Friday there are no frontals or hangings at all, then Easter is white and gold and full of flowers (but if you're using lilies, please remember to remove the stamens!)

Uffington WI. From the edging on a Tudor handkerchief to a show-stopping evening dress for an Oscar-winner, lace has never been out of fashion. And lace-maker and enthusiast Elspeth Bailey took members of Uffington WI through its many forms when she gave a talk at their February meeting. In Britain, hand-made lace was produced in a number of areas, the leaf shape being characteristic of Bedfordshire makers, while flowers and geometric designs denoted Buckinghamshire. Honiton lace was also justly famous. The big fashion era for hand-made lace was the 18th century, when prices went up to several pounds a vard at a time when people were living on a shilling a week. Queen Anne ordered a lace dress which took 40 women seven years to make – the cost must have been eye-watering! And if you really were a dedicated follower of fashion, you might want Continental lace. Smuggling this across the Channel could be a lucrative business - inside loaves of bread or underneath babies in their cots were two of the ruses employed by imaginative traders. Elspeth Bailey brought along some lace-making cushions for the WI to try and we all found that a quick eye and a deft flick of the fingers were the key to success. She was thanked by Marion Francis. At the business meeting which followed, the President, Maggie Carter, welcomed five visitors from Barnack WI and two new Uffington members. Every member received a copy of the photo taken in December to commemorate 100 years of the WI (and 75 years of the Uffington branch). A framed copy will be hung in the village hall. Menus were distributed for the branch's annual birthday dinner next month at the Red Lion, West Deeping. Bursaries for Denman College for 2016 are now open to application from members. This year we're going to share a meal and service following the pattern of the early Christian church, the first followers of Christ.

When Jesus met with his friends in the first Holy Week they shared a meal and fellowship, eating and chatting, before the meal became special and significant in a new way, as Jesus blessed the bread and the wine and gave it to his disciples. We will do the same thing, sitting at table together and sharing a simple meal of bread, cheese and fruit and a glass of wine before hearing the story of that Last Supper and moving on to a celebration of communion, still seated at table.

We will also re-enact some of the other events of that evening. Just as Jesus washed the feet of his disciples (shocking them, because they thought he was too important to do that for them), so the tradition is that the most senior clergy wash the feet of at least some of those present at the service - in a cathedral, it would be the bishop or the dean, here you have to settle for a priest. (NB having your feet washed is not compulsory - volunteers only!). And at the end of the evening, as Jesus and the disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, we move on to the church, where traditional psalms will be read and the altar stripped, ready for the bleakness of Good Friday.

If you'd like to find out more about the Last Supper, and how communion as we know it started, why not come along and find out. This celebration is open to everyone, whether they've been confirmed or not, and is a family occasion where children are welcome (it will go on until at least 8.30pm, but families can opt out of the time in church). 


