



### WILDLIFE & GARDENING IN AUGUST

We say farewell to swifts in early August. They arrive in late April and early May, and spend the next couple of months soaring over rooftops, fields and meadows. They are noted for their acrobatic flying displays — equalled only by Hobbies which chase them through the skies! Their aeronautics are often accompanied by high-pitched screaming calls, and together with their scythe-like wings, they are an unmistakable sight and sound of summer!

They fly in from Africa to escape the hot summers there, and to breed here. They feed, in flight, on flying or airborne insects. Pairing for life, swifts nest in cavities in old buildings and houses, but unfortunately are often excluded from new developments. The nests are a shallow cup of grass, leaves and feathers, all fragments caught on the wing. They have one brood of 2 to 3 eggs in May to June, and may fly up to 800 kilometres in a single day looking for food for their young. If rain threatens, the parents fly away ahead of the weather front, only returning with food when the weather improves. While the parents are away the young go into a state of torpor, lowering their metabolic rate and survive on very little food.

Once fledged, sometime after 5 to 8 weeks, the immature swifts leave the nest and may spend many months — up to three years - feeding and even sleeping, aloft before returning to breed. In a swift's lifetime, which can be up to 9 years, they can fly as much as 1.5 million miles.

The adults leave for Africa again in early August, and the young follow shortly after. They will hopefully return next year bringing summer with them! You might like to think about installing a swift nest box for next year — see http://shopping.rspb.org.uk/swift-nestbox.html - it is something we can do to help these amazing birds. Tim and Donna

### SOMES TRUST STUDENT BURSARY SCHEME 2015

One of the main purposes of the Somes Trust is to promote the education of young people who are either resident in Uffington or who have attended Uffington School. The Trustees are concerned that, with grants being replaced by loans and contributions being required for tuition fees, life has become much tougher for students embarking on higher education. The Trustees want to help ensure that the young people of Uffington get as much as possible from their higher education and have therefore decided to again run a Bursary Scheme for you people under the age of 23 embarking on higher education for the first time. The Bursaries will be discretionary one-off payments and are intended to help cover some of the initial costs of further education such as textbooks, equipment and deposits on accommodation. The size of these awards will depend on the number of successful applicants and the merits of the individual cases, but will not be less than £100.

Applications are invited from people under the age of 23 who are entering full time education for the first time in 2015. To be eligible you must either be resident in the Parish of Uffington, or must have attended Uffington C of E Controlled Primary School. If you want to apply please write to:- The Trustees of the Somes Trust, The Homestead, Greatford Road, Uffington. In your application please state which course you will be doing, which educational establishment you will be attending and what date you start. Please also say if your course if full or part time and whether or not you will be living away from home. The Trustees will need to have details of why the money is needed and what you intend to spend it on.

Applications must be received before September  $20^{th}$  2015. Successful candidates will be notified before  $1^{st}$  October 2015. The Trustees of the Somes Trust.

### THE BISHOP'S LETTER

This year, however, it is inevitable that some of us will do so with a twinge of anxiety. One inevitable result of the recent appalling acts of terrorism in Tunisia, Kuwait and France is a heightened sense of our own vulnerability and mortality. For the friends and family of Carly Lovett and Claire Windass, who were so tragically killed in Tunisia, there is immense sadness as they struggle to come to terms with their loss.

These atrocities were perpetrated by a tiny minority who have a very warped and horrifically misguided view of what it means to be a Muslim, particularly during the month of Ramadan. The teaching of the Christian faith is that love is stronger than evil, and while proper justice is appropriate, revenge and scapegoating are not. It is incumbent upon all of us who follow Christ to continue to welcome the stranger among us, and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

Please hold in your thoughts and prayers all those who have been affected by these tragedies, that through the grace and love of God they may find strength and comfort in the very difficult days ahead. Pray too for the peace of our world, and for men and women of goodwill wherever they may be, that together we may be united in our work for peace and justice in the lives of all God's children.

### WE WILL REMEMBER THEM ....

During August we commemorate the centenary of the death on active service of one of men honoured on the Uffington war memorial.

Private Robert Frisby of the 4th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment died on 9th August 1915

Robert Frisby, son of George and Janet(te) Frisby, was born in Great Casterton in early 1896. George Frisby had married Janette Andrews on  $23^{\rm rd}$  Dec 1878 in Baston. George worked on the land – as an agricultural labourer in Baston in 1881, a farm foreman in Kings Cliffe in 1891 and 1901 and a farm bailiff in Great Casterton in 1911. But by 1915 George and Janet lived at the Bertie Arms in Uffington and military records give the Bertie Arms as Robert's address.

Robert enlisted in the army in Luton, Beds and served in the 4th Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment. The Battalion landed in France in March 1915 and by the summer was deployed to the east of Ypres, where the British and German front line trenches were particularly close together. On 30<sup>th</sup> July 1915, the Battalion (along with others in the same Division) was the target of a new form of attack by the German forces – flamethrowers firing burning liquid into the British trenches. British troops rapidly withdrew, and although the Battalion suffered no deaths during the attack, three men (including Robert) died of wounds in the days following the attack - Robert may therefore have been wounded in the flamethrower attack. Robert, and these other two men, are buried at Etaples Military Cemetery. This is adjacent the area that was home to the principal depot and transit camp for the British forces, near the French Channel coast (a little inland from Le Toquet). The depot had a huge hospital complex, capable of handling, at any one time, up to 22,000 wounded who had been evacuated from the front line, but sadly the cemetery contains the bodies of over 10,700 men and women who died in the hospitals during the course of the war before being transported back to the UK.

Robert, as a resident of Uffington at the time of his enlistment, is commemorated on the parish war memorial in St Michael and All Angels' Church.

Robert Frisby will be specially remembered at a short ceremony to be held during the 10:30 service in Uffington Church on Sunday  $9^{th}$  August.

Robert is one of the 40 fatal casualties during WWI recorded on the war memorials of our seven parishes. It is intended to commemorate each man on or around the centenary of his death — anyone with information or wishing to assist with the remaining research for this project is invited to contact the Rev<sup>d</sup> Martin Brebner (martinbrebner@yahoo.com).
