

WILDLIFE & GARDENING IN JUNE

Roses must one of our best-loved garden plants. If you grow them, then what you certainly do not want to see is your prize specimens affected by Black spot. This is a disease especially prevalent in wet summers, and is caused by a fungus with the Latin name *Diplocarpon rosae*. It shows itself as purple-black blotches on leaves and stems. As the disease progresses the leaves turn yellow and drop prematurely. In bad cases, then all of the leaves may be lost and the plant can be severely weakened. There are several 'non-chemical' things you can do to try and prevent the incidence or reduce the severity of this disease:

- (i) Ensure your plants have good ventilation. This can be achieved by annual pruning, for example for bush roses during early spring, climbers during autumn/winter, ramblers after summer flowering. Standard practice for pruning bush roses is to obtain a goblet shape, with an open centre to help air movement and reduce infection of the leaves by fungal spores. In addition, make sure that you do not plant your roses too close together, and that you do not have lots of herbaceous plants around them.
- (ii) When watering, try and direct your hose or watering can to the base of the rose, to avoid wetting the leaves. Also carry out watering first thing in the morning, to allow any splashes on the leaves to dry out.
- (iii) (iii) Collect any fallen infected leaves, as soon as they have fallen. In an autumn/winter tidy up, ensure that all fallen dead leaves are removed, as the fungus can overwinter in the soil. Burn all infected leaves, but do not use them for compost or you will spread the disease.
- (iv) Ensure your roses are kept healthy by suitable feeding, and use of organic material such as mulching near the stems with well-rotted farmyard manure (which will conserve soil moisture and reduce the need for watering). Plant roses in the best location, with well prepared soil, and a good amount of sunlight.

You can buy new varieties of rose that are bred to be resistant to Black spot. Unfortunately new strains of the disease are continually developing so resistance may be relatively short lived. In spite of all this, do enjoy your roses! **Tim and Donna**

Dear All

You may have noticed that some of the sets of initials labelling services in the chart on the middle pages have changed. FS has become AAW - Family Services have turned into All Age Worship.

The services themselves are still services which welcome everyone – they're for the whole church family (that's why they were called Family Services in the first place). When we baptise children or adults we welcome them into the family of the church, and we quite often talk about the church family - it's an image that speaks of connection and closeness – or at least, it can be. For some people, though, it's a bit more problematical – talking about church and family makes some people feel excluded.

Whether it's called a Family Service or All Age Worship, it's a service for everyone, whatever their age – but sometimes it's understood as meaning for nuclear families, parents and small children, so someone who doesn't have children, or whose children grew up long ago, might think that service isn't for them – just as people who do have young children sometimes think that 'ordinary' services aren't for them. I think the real problem is that we're often not sure of our welcome – and that can apply to any service. We think that church services are really aimed at someone else – those with children, those without, those who are already full members, people who believe really strongly, people who don't have doubts or questions about God, faith and the church, people who belong. Anyone except us.

All our services are open to anyone who would like to come. If you're not used to coming to church, it takes courage to come along for the first time – but you are always invited, always welcome. More than that, you have a right to come to church – the Church of England is not a 'members only' club, it's open to all. It's there for children and adults, those who live alone and those in relationships, people whose faith is strong and people who aren't sure what they believe. You can come alone, with a friend, with your family, you can even ask if someone who already comes to church can collect you; you can come for a special occasion, because you feel like it, because you're in trouble and need someone to talk to, because you want to sing hymns, to pray in company, or just to try something new – God welcomes us all, and we can welcome one another. The family of the church is something we can all be part of.



CASEWICK WARD

BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting and Parish Council Meeting took place at Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Village Hall on 11^{th} May with two members of the public in attendance.

Cllr Dave Kentish was elected as Chairman, the 2014-15 council accounts were approved and it was agreed that the community cleaner's hours would increase from 8 hours to 8.5 hours per month. The Parish Council Meeting followed the AGM.

The overhanging bramble at Ivy Farm House near the Village Hall was still causing a problem. The presentation on Banthorpe/Greatford Level Crossing was cancelled last minute by Network Rail. The Parish Council felt that to meet after the extended deadline of 2^{nd} June had closed was not acceptable. It was agreed that the Council would write another letter of objection to the closure. The clerk reported that various highways issues had been reported since the last meeting.

Councillors agreed to pay a grant of £280.00 each for maintenance of the church yards, £234.45 to Printmashall, the outstanding amount for the Parish Plan (which will be reviewed in 2025) and £187.89 for Council Insurance. All Councillors were given dispensation to be able to discuss the setting of the precept for the duration of this council.

There were no objections to the erection of a single storey rear extension at Shortacre, Braceborough.

C.Cllr Martin Trollope-Bellew reported that the County Council was expecting a decision from the Boundary Commission regarding the number of Councillors. He also said that there were Review Groups looking into Unitary Authorities, Homes to School Transport and Scrutiny.

The date for the next meeting is Monday 8^{th} June at St Faith's Church, Wilsthorpe at 7.30pm. All welcome.



Uffington WI. 'Living With Alpacas' was the title of Rachel Shoon's talk at Uffington WI's May meeting – and there clearly isn't a dull moment living with the herd she and her husband run at Belmesthorpe, near Stamford. The couple made a conscious decision some years ago to create a simpler lifestyle for themselves in the countryside, believing, as Rachel said, that '21st century society is moving too fast for its own good'. They practise animal homeopathy and reiki, committing themselves to giving their animals the best life they can. Their 29-strong herd of alpacas has been growing steadily and produces a luxury fibre which is light, soft and warm. It contains no lanolin to irritate the skin, making it suitable for babies and allergy sufferers. Rachel brought along her spinning wheel, together with examples of garments knitted from alpaca fleece, and demonstrated carding and spinning. She was thanked by Margaret Walker. After the talk, the 2014-15 Competition Cup was presented to Brenda Francis, and President Maggie Carter revealed that the WI cake stall at the Uffington Scarecrow Festival the previous weekend had raised £160. She thanked members who made cakes and gave up their time to run the stall, and thanked Sheila Croft for making the WI's scarecrow. The programmes for the coming year were distributed: future talks will include the history of Stamford Racecourse, trekking in Nepal, quilting, lace-making, and conjuring tricks. The branch has been asked to contribute craft work and floristry to the South Lincs Federation WI Centenary exhibition at Sleaford in September. It plans to visit lordan's Mill in Bedfordshire in June. Carole Chapman read out the NFWI's 2015 Resolution, to be debated at the WI's annual meeting in London on June 4: 'That this meeting calls on HM Government to remove the distinction between nursing care and personal care in the assessment of the needs of individuals, in order to advance health and wellbeing'. With only hours to go before the General Election, and the possibility of political change, the branch decided to leave the option to back the move open to its delegate on the day.
