

WILDLIFE AND GARDENING IN APRIL

"The cuckoo comes in April, Sings his song in May, In the middle of June, he changes his tune, And in July he flies away."

This familiar ditty accurately sets out the comings and goings of the cuckoo – a once-familiar summer visitor. The first arrivals and their call (reported in the *The Times* newspaper) tell us that summer is not far off! Cuckoos arrive in the 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} week of April after spending the winter in Africa, spreading throughout the country and are found in a wide-range of habitats. The male has the double-noted 'cuckoo' call and the female a bubbling call. Both are Sparrowhawk size, dark blue with white speckled underparts and with pointed wings and a long tail.

The cuckoo is famous — or infamous — for laying its eggs in other birds' nests. Their favourite victims are Dunnock, Reed Warbler and Meadow Pipits, but they are known to use the nests of more than 50 other species! The female removes an egg from the host's nest replacing with one of her own, and can lay up to a dozen eggs around her territory. The young hatch, evict the other eggs and nestlings, are reared by their foster parents and leave the country in September finding their own way to Africa.

The Cuckoo Flower was so-called because it blooms in April and May the months during which the Cuckoo sings its distinctive call. This plant can grow flowering stems up to about 2ft, and is found in damp pastures, meadows, wilder gardens, road-side verges and by streams throughout Britain. Its flowers range in colour from deep lilac to white. This plant is also known as 'Lady's Smock' or 'Milkmaid'.

Another cuckoo association is 'cuckoo-spit' a foamy liquid substance which can cover the Cuckoo Flower but has nothing to do with cuckoos! It is actually produced by the nymphs (the young) of an insect called the Frog-hopper, which lives and feeds on plants, such the Cuckoo Flower, and produces the cuckoo-spit as a protection from predators. **Donna and Tim**

Dear Friends

In mid-April we mark the dramatic events at the heart of the Christian gospel – starting with the commemoration of Christ's dramatic entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the Last Supper that He shared with His disciples on Maundy Thursday, His crucifixion on Good Friday to His glorious resurrection on Easter Day. All these events will be commemorated in our churches.

On Palm Sunday, the traditional palm crosses will be distributed during the services at Greatford, West Deeping, Uffington and Tallington. On the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week, at the (short) Communion services at Greatford, Uffington and West Deeping, we have the opportunity to hear more of the events of the week before Christ's crucifixion. And on Maundy Thursday we remember the Last Service, starting in Braceborough Village Hall at 7pm.

On Good Friday there is a morning service at West Deeping at IIam, followed by the opportunity to walk (on footpaths), via Tallington (where prayers will be said at around 12:30pm) to Uffington for the service at 2pm, marking Christ's last hour on the cross – you are very welcome to dip in or out of this sequence at any time. We close Good Friday with reflections on the Passion at Barholm at 7pm.

On Easter Day there will be the usual dawn service at 5:15am at Wilsthorpe – this is the latest it can be! It is now quite challenging to hold seven communion services on Easter morning as we don't know any priests who can be in two places at once! So this year there is one change of time: there will services of Holy Communion at Wilsthorpe at 8am; Barholm, Braceborough and Greatford 9am; West Deeping (including baptism) at 10:15am; and Tallington and Uffington at 10:30am. You will however realise that Carolyn is still ill, and should she not be fully fit by Easter the times of one or two services may need to be changed – any alterations will be advertised in all the churches as soon as they are known.

But at whatever time suits you, do come and join us during this great season of the Christian year celebrate anew the love of God demonstrated in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and the new life He gives us.

The readings for Communion services are normally the NT and Gospel. For Morning and Evening Prayer they are usually the Psalm, OT and NT (though it may be wise to check with the preacher). But in the Easter season, the Acts' reading is always used at all services. The liturgical colour at the beginning of the month is purple for Lent, changing to red for Palm Sunday and the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week. Maundy Thursday is white and on Good Friday there are no frontals or hangings. Easter Day is white and gold, and sees the return of flowers for the first time since the beginning of Lent.

NOTES FROM BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 3RD MARCH 2014 AT BRACEBOROUGH VILLAGE HALL

The clerk reported that she had contacted Delaine Bus Company and The Rector but no reply received from either. It was reported that a fallen tree was still across footpath No 6 Wilsthorpe to Baston.

It was agreed that members of the Parish Council had no objection to the removal of two cedar trees at The Stables, Braceborough. It was agreed that the request from Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Village Hall for money towards a new heating system may be included in future planning applications.

Concern was expressed about the state of the verges and various ideas were discussed on how to stop vehicles from driving over the grass and leaving ruts. The new drainage work which had taken place from The Elms down Quincey's Lane seemed to have solved the problem of flooding but it was felt that the road surface had been badly done and the contractors had left a pile of mud on the side. It was agreed that a Highways walkabout was required.

Cllr. Kentish gave an update on the Parish Plan. It was agreed that a short history of Wilsthorpe should be included. Cllr Shorrock reported that both villages should have the use of a Defibrillator with a training session for the volunteers in the near future. Further information would be available nearer the time.

C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that LCC Health Scrutiny Committee met with the Ambulance Service. The MOD is closing its Military Unit at Peterborough City Hospital as from April. It has been agreed that 3.8million will be spent on Stamford Hospital. Greatford First Time Rural Sewerage Scheme has had problems due to the high water table. LCC Highways will ask Anglianwater for a contribution towards the repair of verges. LCC Highways are behind in digging out grips because the budget has been reduced but hopes to use the remaining balance from the gritting fund. County Councillors have accepted the Independent Remuneration Panels proposal to increase councillor's salaries. Finally, County Councillors will be attending a briefing on Fracking in April.

Date of next meeting- Monday 7th April 2014 at Braceborough Village Hall at 7pm. This will commence with the Annual Parish Meeting which is an opportunity for everyone to come along and take part. It is a time for various organizations to come along and give a brief report on what has been taking place during the year. Please come along and support the parish and meet your local Councillors.

Both LCC Highways and Lincs. Road Safety Partnership both consider that a "Stop" sign at the Greatford Road/Charters junction is not justified, C. Cllr. Trollope-Bellew stated that at best a "Give Way" sign may be erected by Highways. The gates either side of the railway line on Footpath 4 has now been unlocked. The request for a "Slippery Road" sign on Barnack road has been declined as there is a grit bin in this location. Mr R Irvine had obtained from LRSP data on the Greatford Road Speed Monitoring for five days from 12th July, 2013. **Inbound to Uffington** - 3804 vehicles - Over the limit 69.8%; More than 10 mph over 13.6%; More than 20 mph over 1.1%. **Outbound from Uffington** - 3944 vehicles - Over the limit 87.6%; More than 10 mph over 39.9%; More than 20 mph over 6.7%.

Allotment rent to remain at £12 pa. The half allotment has now been let.

The Lindsey Road street naming sign that has fallen over is due for repair by SKDC

Various pot holes in the village have been reported to Highways.

C. Cllr. M. Trollope-Bellew reported that the Peterborough and Stamford Hospital Trust Military Unit was coming to an end on 1st April, 2014 loosing 149 nurses and auxiliary staff.

All thirty 3rd Tier Libraries have had expressions of interest for volunteers to run them.

TALLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

The following two updates from Network Rail concerning the level crossing were received by the parish council and handed out at the parish council meeting on Tuesday II March 2014. Perhaps the more informative update is the second one dated II March. You will note the words in italics and the statement that the option 2 route, locally called the southern "in village route", progressing any further is receding. This statement concerning the southern "in village" route will be welcomed in Tallington. The parish council will continue to support and seek support from other bodies for the original bypass route to the north. Geoff Mayling, Chairman Parish Council

UPDATE FROM NETWORK RAIL RECEIVED 5 MARCH 2014: "Network Rail has appointed Mott MacDonald (MM) consulting engineers to carry out feasibility studies at level crossings on a section of the ECML, first and foremost being Tallington. We met with MM this week in York to pass across information we hold regarding previous work carried out either by Network Rail or others. We have also asked MM to take a fresh look at this, to see if there are other options we should be considering. We will be meeting with LCC shortly to introduce our consultants, explain the process we will be going through, engage their support and to ensure that all of the "historic" information available for them to review. Over the next 2-3 months, surveys will be carried out of road/foot and rail traffic, barrier down times, traffic modelling, environmental impact assessments etc in order to prepare options for consideration. Once we are in a position to present potential solutions for discussion, we will undertake a first round of consultation meetings (anticipated early summer) with LCC, the District Council and of course the Parish Council. We will also discuss these potential solutions with other stakeholders and interest groups - including representatives of the Tallington Bypass Action Group, who have been in contact with me recently. The feedback from these discussions will then be reviewed and potential solutions developed further so that cost estimates can be produced in parallel of course there will be discussions about affordability and funding with LCC and potentially with DofT depending largely upon the extent of new highway required for each of the options taken forward".

UPDATE FROM NETWORK RAIL RECEIVED 11 MARCH 2014: "During our conversation today I explained that until our feasibility study is completed, I am reluctant to rule any scenarios out entirely. The letter we received from Lincolnshire CC states that the Council would not support a route through the village which would involve demolition of residential property. It is clear that Network Rail would need LCC's support in order to find an affordable solution, so the likelihood of "Option 2" progressing any further is therefore receding. As you know we have engaged consultants to take a fresh look at Tallington and see if there are further options we should be considering. It is conceivable that one of these options would still see a new bridge built close to the existing level crossing, linking in somehow with the main road through the village. We would then be able to compare the cost/benefit between an "in village" option and the obvious (but significantly more expensive) route originally proposed involving a bypass to the north. We will be working closely with Brian Thompson and his colleagues at LCC and are due to meet later this month to discuss Tallington specifically. We will also be discussing the proposal for a joint LCC/NR approach to central government to seek additional funding for the highways element".


