



UFFIGNTON SUNDAY CLUB AND SCHOOL OUTREACH REPORT 2013

This year in Sunday Club we have looked at various bible stories such as: the story of the lost sheep. Mary and Martha, and the calling of the first disciples. We made salt dough candle holders when we talked about the reference to salt and light in Matthew's gospel. We have also followed the church year. At Pentecost we used bubbles, flags and paper planes to represent the Holy Spirit arriving like a rushing wind. We prepared for Christmas by making advent trees to mark the four Sundays in advent. Then for Easter we made a colourful banner to celebrate Christ's victory over death. We have continued our close connection with Uffington School. A joint church and school committee has been set up to coordinate activities and this has worked very well. We have been involved with various activities with the school. Dear All

1 was listening to the radio the other day when 1 heard a piece about a pop-up Death Café. Yes, 1 found it a bit mind-boggling, too, but it turned out to be a very interesting thing. It's effectively a discussion group, usually a one-off, that lasts an hour or two, and is always accompanied by a drink and some snacks – hence the café. It might be in someone's home or in a hall, or sometimes they take over an actual café, but wherever it is there's just one main topic: death.

It's often said that our modern society is unfamiliar with death in a way that never used to happen, with most people dying in hospital, and a general – and not unrealistic expectation that we'll live a good long time. Of course there are still people who die tragically young, but these days even someone who dies in their sixties or even seventies can leave us feeling that we've somehow been cheated – they should have made it to their eighties or nineties. A century ago, even before the terrible casualties of the first war, everyone knew people who had died from their childhood on – if not their own brother or sister, then a friend or cousin, parent or grandparent. The people behind Death Café realised that many people now get to their thirties or even forties without losing someone close to them, and without ever really having the chance to think or talk about death – and often we avoid doing so as if talking things over or making any preparations, like making a will or leaving instructions about favourite hymns, might make death happen sooner.

One of the things I was taught at college was that it's my responsibility to use the words dead and dying, as so many people avoid them – listen to the Monty Python parrot sketch to hear just how many ways we've found not to say dead. That's at least partly why a Death Café sounds so strange. But all it does is accept that death is going to happen to all of us, sooner or later, and give us a chance to talk about it – how we feel about death, what sort of funeral we'd like, how we'd like to be remembered – and that could help us to work out what kind of life we'd like to live, too. One journalist who went (rather nervously) to a café realised that it felt a bit strange, but that speaking to a stranger about whether she'd like to be buried or cremated was easier than starting that same conversation with her husband when he came home from work – but I'm sure that having had the conversation with a stranger made it easier to talk to her husband.

1 don't know whether there would be any demand for a Death Café here – if you'd be interested, let me know – but of course you can always talk to the clergy, and you might even use this letter as a conversation starter with someone in your family or a friend. If you want to think about the practical things, there's a form called Time to Choose available in church which helps you to think about what sort of service you would like (and if you live another fifty years, you can always change your mind). But don't forget to think and talk about your feelings, whether you're a bit scared, absolutely terrified, or ready and raring to go. And consider how you'd like to be remembered – and work out what you need to do now to make that possible. Because thinking and talking about death isn't depressing – it's part of life, and about living life to the full.

READINGS FOR JULY

The colour in church is green for the Sundays after Trinity.

As noted elsewhere there will be an exhibition connected with the anniversary of the start of the First World War in St Faith's Church, Wilsthorpe on 2 and 3 August. As usual Holy Communion will be celebrated in St Faith's Church at 10:30 on Sunday 3 August, but this will be a special service marking the centenary. At 5pm on the same day there will be a short service in St Faith's Church based on a centenary vigil published by the Church of England – the centrepiece of which is the extinguishing of 4 candles (echoing "the lights are going out over Europe") followed at the reading of a gospel passage by the lighting of another candle remind us of the light that Christ brings even in deepening darkness. A similar vigil will conclude the regular service of Evening Prayer at St Martin's Barholm on the same day. As usual anyone from any of the seven parishes (and beyond!) would be more than welcome at any of these services. Over the next four years, several churches in the Group are likely to mark the centenaries of the deaths of the 40 men (listed below) commemorated on war memorials in our seven churches – perhaps with a short ceremony after the service in the relevant church on the Sunday nearest the anniversary. The lives of some of the men have already been researched but if anyone has information on any of the individuals or would like to help with further research please contact Martin Brebner (preferably via martinbrebner@vahoo.com).

Greatford Continued:

Proposed Solar Farm: A special meeting was held in Greatford Village Hall on 20th May to discuss a potential planning application for a 128 acre solar farm on land bounded by King Street, Baston Road and Wilsthorpe Road. As well as Greatford residents, parish councillors from Braceborough, Wilsthorpe, Baston & Barholm, and a SKDC Principal Planning Officer were present.

SKDC had been approach by a potential developer and had confirmed that Environmental Impact Assessment would be required with any planning application.

The meeting heard that the site was classified as Grade 2 'best and most versatile agricultural land,' and traversed by an overhead power cable (facilitating connection to the National Grid – though this would preclude and direct benefit to local residents by way of cheap electricity). Solar sites normally required appropriate landscaping and screening to reduce adverse visual impact the hedging proposed would take 15-20 years to obscure the surrounding railings; and as King Street is higher than proposed site the metal security fence, 2.2m high solar panels and associated 3.62 metre high inverter/transformer building would remain visible for a longer period. It was noted that there are large areas of former gravel extraction sites to the east of Baston and Langtoft which could be suitable for solar sites although this could be costly for a developer because of the distance from overhead power lines.

Justin Johnson, Principal Planning Officer at SKDC informed the meeting that any Planning Application would be notified to the relevant Parish Councils affected, and any residents affected and publicised in the normal way. SKDC would have to take a decision within 16 weeks, which would include a 3-week consultation period. The application would be considered by SKDC's Development Control Committee, and the Parish Council and objectors and supporters would be able to address the Committee (for a maximum of 3 minutes each). The Committee could only consider planning issues, such as visual impact, landscape changes, ecology, rights of way, quality of agricultural soil (important but not an automatic refusal issue), flood risk, change of use of land, heritage aspects, and national guidance (on which Justin said that the Government was steering towards use of brown-field sites in preference to agricultural land). The Committee could only pay attention to the relevance and strength of the material planning arguments, rather than the volume of representations. The refusal of an application could be appealed to the Planning Inspectorate.

Prior to the meeting a questionnaire was distributed to all households in Greatford. By 29 May about one third of properties had responded (but there is no deadline so please keep the replies coming in). Based on the information available so far 63 adults have expressed opposition to a solar site; 2 have shown support and 2 are currently undecided.

UFFINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Report from APM and AGM of Uffington Parish Council held on Wednesday, 21st May, 2014 in the Village Hall.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Cllr. Genever was voted in as Chairman. The One Way System seems to be working with most motorists obeying the layout. It was confirmed by C. Cllr. Trollope-Bellew that cyclists can cycle in both directions so long as they stay within the designated route. PCSO M. Laughton be asked to attend near the school to monitor the traffic at the busy period when the school drop of time seems to coincide with traffic using Uffington as a rat run. Various pot holes in an around the village are to be reported to Highways. C. Cllr. Trollope Bellew and Dist.Cllr. R. Woolley gave their annual report these can be view on the Uffington Web Site together with the full Minutes.

AGM OF PARISH COUNCIL

Cllr. Genever was voted in as Chairman with Cllr. Babbs as Vice Chairman. Cllr. Mulvaney resigned from the Village Hall Committee due to work commitments. If there is anyone out there willing to represent the Parish Council on the Village Hall Committee please contact the Clerk, Yvonne Genever 01780 76347. (Obviously you don't have to be on the Parish Council). This is a good way to meet other village people and help to keep the Village Hall going. Network Rail are doing a feasibility study on the Tallington Rail By Pass to see if it can go any further. The 2 most probable routes have been priced at £23M & £15M. Highway had replied to the Parish Council stating that any major alterations to Lodge Corner to try to stop the accidents would cost too much which they are not willing to undertake. The speed limit on this corner has been assessed and this location does not meet the criteria as there is no developed frontage to extend the speed limit out of the village. Planning permission had been received for a Single Storey Ext 17 Lindsey Road and a Tennis Court at The Lodge Casewick. Refusal of Planning permission for a retrospective application for erection of shed 75 Main Road. The application for 3 dwellings on Main next to West Hall Farm was discussed at a previous Parish Planning Meeting and the comments were forwarded to SKDC. The allotment taps have been fitted with non-return valves to conform to Anglian Water's rules and regulations. C.Cllr. Trollope-Bellew suggested that the Parish Council meet with Highways for a village walkabout to point out any problems. 

WILDLIFE GARDENING IN JULY

Growing climbing plants is an excellent way of attracting wildlife into your garden, especially if space is limited. Climbing shrubs can provide valuable shelter, nesting and roosting sites, and give food through nectar and berries. We have mentioned two of the best - ivy and honeysuckle - in previous articles.

Some of you will be sure to have another popular woody climber, Wisteria, maybe adorning the side of your house, or an outbuilding. A good display of its scented white or blue (rarely pink) hanging flowers in May and June is certainly a sight to behold. In its native Asia and North America, this member of the pea family is a forest dweller, climbing up into trees or cliffs to over 40 metres. In our gardens it is kept as a shrub by periodic pruning.

There are about half a dozen species of Wisteria, but two of the most commonly grown are *Wisteria sinensis* (Chinese Wisteria) and *W.floribunda* (Japanese Wisteria). Interestingly, the former climbs anticlockwise and the latter clockwise.

Wisteria needs pruning each year to keep its growth within bounds, and to improve flowering. This is carried out twice a year, in July/August (the summer prune) and then in January/February (winter prune). This month, or in August, cut back the long green whippy shoots of this summer's growth to five or six leaves. In January/February you then cut back the same stems you pruned the previous summer, to just 2 or 3 buds. This should ensure that your next display of flowers will not be obscured by lots of leafy growth. It is to be emphasised that as Wisteria pruning is likely to involve work at height from a ladder, that all special safety considerations should be exercised.

Bringing things more to ground level, Wisteria can also be grown in containers as a standard. Tim and Donna

WILSTHORPE

Notes from Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Parish Council Meeting held on 9th June at Wilsthorpe Church.

During the Public Forum concern was expressed about the number of potholes and lack of verges being cut. The villages were being used as a diversion around Greatford. It was agreed that residents may cut verges if it was safe to do so. The Clerk informed the meeting that SKDC had not received a planning application for the proposed solar farm at Wilsthorpe Farm, Greatford. Highways had been contacted about the verges etc but no reply to date. The BT Kiosks at both villages had been dealt with by BT. The Council adopted a complaints procedure, a copy of which will be placed on the website. It was agreed that no representation from the Parish Council in regards to the erection of a 1.8m fence at Spa Road, Braceborough and no comments for the call by LCC for mineral sites until an application was received. As there had been a general lack of verge cutting it was suggested that the Parish Council take on the responsibility. The clerk informed the meeting that she understood grants were available from both authorities. Flooding had again been a problem on the Wilsthorpe Road, Braceborough. Cllr Burgoin reported that there had been damage to the footpath by a vehicle near Autumn Cottage. Cllr. Kentish reported that he had received 50 replies out of a possible 122 questionnaires relating to the Parish Plan. Cllr. Shorrock showed the defibrillator purchased for Wilsthorpe and reported that it was hoped that the equipment would be sited at the Church. C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that Network Rail would be holding a public exhibition in June at Tallington Village Hall in regards to the closure of roads and footpaths in the area. He had also received reports that some of the culverts in Wilsthorpe were higher than the dyke which could impede the flow of water. The government is introducing a new way for people to register to vote at elections. Instead of using a household form to register, everyone will take individual responsibility for their own registration, which could be done on line, by phone or in person as well as by paper. Most people who are currently registered to vote will be automatically transferred to the new register without having to take action.
