



WILDLIFE GARDENING IN MARCH

The Butterfly Bush (*Buddleja davidii*) is beloved of wildlife gardeners for its cones of lilac-purple summer flowers which are a magnet for nectar feeding butterflies and other insects. To prevent it becoming a leggy and unruly shrub, and to encourage young growth and flowering, you can prune established plants during March, providing the danger of hard frosts has passed. Cutting at this time shouldn't prevent flowering during the coming summer, because in this species, flowers are borne on the current year's growth.

Cut back stems to within two or three healthy buds of the woody framework at the base of your *Buddleja*. On mature shrubs dead or unproductive parts of this woody framework can be sawn or lopped off. Always wear suitable protective gear for this type of work e.g. goggles and good stout gloves. You can always use cuttings to add to a woody pile located in a suitable part of your garden to encourage insects, fungi etc. By changing the cutting height of the woody framework you can tailor the height of the *Buddleja*, to where it is located in your garden border. For example, you may want to encourage the development of a taller shrub at the back of the border.

Remember that, although Butterfly Bush is the more commonly known species of *Buddleja*, there are others, where the flowers are instead borne on the previous years growth, and these should be cut at different times, e.g. in midsummer, or late winter, and some also where pruning is seldom required. If you aren't sure as to the identity of your *Buddleja*, try checking during the summer, using the flowers and a good guidebook or from the internet.

There are a whole range of different cultivars of Butterfly Bush, so we are quite spoilt for choice in terms of flower colour. For example: 'Black Knight' (dark violet-purple), 'Royal Red' (rich red-purple), 'White Cloud' (pure white in dense spikes), 'Fortune' (pure lilac with orange eye). Cutting off spent flowers during the summer, can prolong the season of flowering, and also prevent Butterfly Bush seeding across your garden. **Tim and Donna**

Dear Friends.

The flow of the church calendar does not generally get wide attention – leaving aside Christmas and Easter of course! But in March we have two events which give rise to wider attention:

Early in the month, the start of Lent will be heralded in many households (knowingly or not) by the consumption of pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. Pancakes were considered to be a good way of using up foodstuffs like milk, eggs and sugar that in previous times Christians stopped eating in Lent as they recalled the way in which Jesus fasted for forty days at the start of his earthly ministry. The practice of *giving up something for Lent* is still observed and the Easter eggs that children hunt for in some of our churches and churchyards on Easter Day are meant to be a reward for giving up chocolate in Lent (though perhaps sometimes they may not be always fully earned!). Whether or not you give up something for Lent, it is an especially good time to recall the immense love and holiness shown by Jesus during his life on earth and earnestly seek God's help to live up to those standards – feel free to join us at the service of Ashing on Ash Wednesday or any of the services during Lent to help deepen that understanding of God's love and holiness.

Then late in the month, we have the special day which flows from an ancient tradition that children who had left home village returned to their *Mother Church* (the church of their youth or possibly their cathedral church) once a year, in mid-Lent. In the days when travelling would have been slow and laborious, any one returning to the area of their childhood home would have taken the opportunity to visit their mother and family, and historians suggest that as the youngsters walked along the country lanes, they would pick wild flowers (which were just appearing in the spring) to take to church or give to their mother as a small gift. For many the visit to the family would have been the highlight of the mid-Lent journey, rather than the visit to their Mother Church. Children walking home on Mothering Sunday is largely a thing of the past, but do join us at the Group Service in Tallington Church on Sunday 30 March at 10:30am (British Summer Time as it will be by then!) – posies will be available for children (of all ages!) to give to mothers.

You will realise from the fact that I have written this month's letter, that Carolyn is still unwell. She hopes she will soon be fit enough to be back with us — and we wish her speedy progress. I am most grateful to all those who have helped maintain the ministry of the church since Christmas (especially John Batty, Geoff & Donna Radley and Les Baillie, and also The Dean of Stamford, Mark Warrick), and we hope to continue running smoothly. But if Carolyn's return to work is much delayed and we have to make tweak the pattern of services at all we would naturally advertise this as widely as possible in all the churches.

WDeeping continued:

West Deeping's Roll of Honour. Community groups in the Deepings will be commemorating the First World War with various events, including a display of stories, pictures and memorabilia of the people who saw active service or contributed to the war effort in other ways. Finding out about the people from West Deeping has begun — the plaque in St Andrews Church tells us that 8 men lost their lives, but another 40 or so enlisted and came back! West Deeping Heritage Group has access to some information resources for the period – like the 1911 Census, the Parish Council Minute Books and the School Log book — but could do with some help to look through it all and write up the story of our Roll of Honour. NOTES FROM BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON 3RD FEBRUARY 2014 AT BRACEBOROUGH VILLAGE HALL

A presentation by Kier Petherick from FC Palmer & son regarding a proposed Solar Farm, Baston Road, Greatford. A question & answer session then took place with visual impact being the greatest concern of residents.

The Clerk reported that Lincolnshire County Council had reported back on various highways problems raised at the previous meeting. It was agreed that to help solve the problem of poor visibility at Cocked Hat/Main Street the hedge should be cut back.

The Councillors agreed that there would be no representation to the application from James Shorrock, The Orchard, Wilsthorpe. The application from OHL Ltd, lvy Farmhouse, Braceborough was for notification. Anglianwater – construction of new sewerage pumping station & access road on land off Wilsthorpe Lane was approved by Lincolnshire County Council (LCC). Anglianwater had agreed to donate £500 to the Parish Council towards the cost of painting the church at Wilsthorpe.

Cllr Kentish reported that he hoped to have the questionnaire for the Parish Plan with the printers in the near future. A tree which was blocking the footpath from Wilsthorpe to Baston would be dealt with by Mr Freeman.

Library provision at Braceborough would cease after 6th May 2014. LCC & SKDC were trying to help residents save money on energy bills by asking them to sign up to Lincolnshire Energy Switch.

C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that there would be zero increase in the County Council Community charge. The Deepings had expressed an interest to run their own Library. The Gritting Lorries had not been out as much as last year and would therefore come in on/under budget.

Date of next meeting- Monday 3rd March 2014 at Braceborough Village Hall at 8pm. It was agreed that the Annual Parish Meeting would be held at Braceborough on Monday 7th April, with the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council to be held at Wilsthorpe on Monday 12th May both at 7pm. All welcome.
