WILDLIFE GARDENING IN AUGUST

Hot dry weather brings with it the challenge of maintaining water levels in your wildlife pond. Topping up is best carried out using rain-water – your garden water-butt is a good source for this. However first make sure that the water is fresh, which is easily checked using your nose! (Stagnant water will often have a smell of rotting eggs, which is hydrogen sulphide gas being released). Tap water is not so good as a top-up, as it contains chemical additives, which can encourage the growth of pond algae. However if tap water is your only source then let it stand in open containers for as long as possible before adding to your pond so that any dissolved chlorine gas can be reduced.

The summer sunlight and high temperatures often encourage the growth of pond algae, known as blanketweed. This can be removed by twirling a bamboo cane around in the water, or using a net. Take special care to keep the end of any cane away from the pond liner to prevent puncturing. Removed algae can be deposited next to your pond, to let aquatic beasts crawl back in, and the slime can then be disposed of. You might alternatively have green coloured pond water, again caused by algae. Although this can't be removed by the bamboo cane or net approach, you might instead try a proprietary barley straw extract as a remedy. This breaks down in the water, and substances toxic to algae are released.

If you have algal growth in your pond, this indicates that the water is enriched. The long-term solution is to ensure there are sufficient submerged and pond-side water plants, which will oxygenate the water, and use up dissolved pond nutrients. If using planting baskets to introduce your plants, ensure you use washed gravel or special pond compost as your planting medium, as garden soil will enrich the water. If your pond is stocked with fish, then excess numbers can also increase nutrients in the water, causing algal growth.

One final tip, if your pond is constructed using pond liner, you can cover the unattractive exposed edges, (which are particularly revealed in spells of dry weather), by planting low, sprawling, quick growing plants next to the edge such as saxifrages, thyme etc. **Tim and Donna**

The Rectory

Dear Friends,

My mind this month has been running very much on baptisms, godparents and godchildren. Three of my (five) godchildren have had birthdays in the last few weeks, including the oldest who has now bought his first flat, and the youngest-but-one who celebrated his eighteenth birthday this month, and is now waiting for his A level results. Then, in the group, there have been baptisms galore – four on one day in Uffington last month - which has been great fun, celebrating with all those families as we officially welcome their children into the family of the church. Add to that the pieces in the paper about potential changes to the baptism service, and you can see why baptism has been on my mind!

At one of the baptism services I had a conversation with a new godparent who felt very privileged to take on the job - but not really sure how to be a godparent, once the service was over, though he clearly took the whole thing very seriously.

I think probably the most important things a godparent can give a child are time and love. A godparent can be an extra person to relate to and talk to, someone who makes a child know that they're special, someone they can trust.

Having that close relationship with a godchild then makes the rest of the job much easier - supporting the child, supporting the family, and helping the child to grow up in faith, until they're old enough to explore for themselves. I've listened to my godchildren saying their prayers, I've taken them to explore empty churches and sat with them in services, I've added a bible story book to their Christmas or birthday present - and sat and read it to them, I've answered their questions as best I could.

They're not all choosing faith - one famously informed us when he was nine that he was giving up on God and the tooth fairy, but sticking to Father Christmas because 'everybody has to believe in something' (not least, we suspect, Christmas presents) - but at least they are hearing about God and experiencing church, they know that they belong, or can if they want to - and who knows, even my nine-year-old atheist may rediscover God as he grows up, with the gentle encouragement of his parents and godparents, and their time, love and support.

NOTES FROM BRACEBOROUGH & WILSTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - 7TH JULY AT WILSTHORPE CHURCH

During the Public Forum a resident said he was pleased to see a reactive speed sign at Wilsthorpe. Cllr Kentish reported that one had been placed along Spa Road, Braceborough during the previous week. It is also hoped that new traffic calming signs will be available in the very near future.

Cllr Kentish thanked Ambrose Kingston for arranging for some highway verges to be cut at various danger points within the Parish. The Councillors are considering the possibility of bringing the mowing 'In house' for 2015. A small grant is available from the County Council but it is hoped that residents would be able to help by cutting their own front verges where possible. If anyone is able to assist, please contact the clerk giving their name and address so that it can be marked on a map for reference.

Cllr Kentish gave an update on the latest Neighbourhood Police Panel Meeting, with the biggest issue being speed management. It was reported that a motor home had been parked by the Chipping Dump on a number of occasions, this had been reported. Cllr Morriss had painted the bench at Braceborough. Cllr Shorrocks reported that the defibrillator would soon be installed in the Church at Wilsthorpe. Councillors would be looking at the questionnaires returned for the Parish Plan. The footpath damaged at Wilsthorpe had been reported by no action to date.

The proposed closure of Tallington and Greatford Level Crossings plus the footpath from Casewick to Barholm were discussed. It was agreed that the Parish Council would object to both routes suggested for Tallington, only the original northern route (which was not included) would solve the problem. They felt that they did not wish to see the crossing at Greatford close but there were two other routes available for vehicles. They did object to the diversion of the footpath as they felt that the logical solution would be for it to follow the bridleway. It was also suggested that a bridge should be built or an underpass for pedestrian use. Finally they felt that people would still continue to use the old route over the railway between Casewick & Barholm and should therefore remain open as no accidents had been reported.

C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that Lincolnshire County Council would be expected to make savings of £90 million next year, which meant about 500 redundancies. Caroline Walker from Peterborough Hospital Trust attended a LCC Health Security Committee meeting. There are still problems at City Hospital. It is still hoped to sell part of Stamford Hospital and reinvest the money by improving facilities on the site. A trial is taking place at Stamford Fire station with a combined Fire/Ambulance hub. It is hoped to improve response time in the south which are very poor.

Cllr Shorrocks suggested that more first aid training should take place within the villages. Date of next meeting- Monday 8th September 2014 at Braceborough & Wilsthorpe Village Hall at 7.30pm. UFFINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Report from Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday, 9th July, 2014 at 8pm in the Village Hall.

Tallington By Pass – LCC, Tallington and also Uffington Parish Council are objecting to the two proposed routes one that goes through the vial and other that would need to demolish some houses. C. Cllr. M. Trollope-Bellew reported that there would be a further public meeting to discuss this.

Lodge Corner - LCC Highways are not prepared to carry out any safety work on this corner.

Bertie Lane grassy area leak - The Parish Council are trying to get a decision on this leak. At the moment neither Highways (whose contractors damaged this area whilst repairing the footpath) or Anglian Water will not take responsibility for this leak.

Play Area – Decisions on grants are still being waited for, the Somes Trust has made a donation towards this project for which we are very grateful.

Highway walkabout – Mr. K. Brumfield, LCC Highways and members of the Parish Council met and various problem in and around the village were reported.

Uffington to Barholm Footpath – The sleepers over the railway line have now been reinstated.

Lincs Advice Network – Lottery funding has enabled Lincolnshire residents to be able to access advice, information and support agencies across the country in one place from a new service called Lincs2SAdvice Tel 08442570042 or www.lincolnshireadvicenetwork.org.uk. Email infohub@lincs2advice.org.uk

Dist. Cllr. Woolley stated that the Gravity Field festival will be taking place 24th – 28th September, details are on School Lane notice board or from the Clerk.

Planning - No objection of replace rear velux window with a dormer – 13 School Lane - Saunders Refusal of planning permission for 3 dwellings and creation of vehicular access on land between West Hall Farm and 9 Main Road – Hereward Homes
An Appeal against retrospective application for the erection of a shed 75 Main Road – Lord has been submitted to SKDC

The Parish Council Audit has been completed by Grant Thornton and returned.

The Parish Council had been requested to contact the owners of 75 Main Road to ask him if they would trim back their hedge to make it safer for pedestrians crossing the road at this point.

Closing Tallington Level Crossing

The first stage consultation period has now taken place. The second Network Rail presentation took place on Saturday 24th June. The format of the second presentation was exactly the same as the first presentation but this time only approx 70 people attended. Therefor a total of approx 275 attended the two presentations.

NR displayed two options namely the "in line route" and the "in village route". The continuing theme throughout the presentations was the question to NR's representatives "why are you not displaying the "original northern route". Their answer appears to be that this option cannot be funded.

Our answer to that is that they have been defeatist and have prematurely dismissed this option without trying to seek funding from the Department of Transport. We have requested figures from NR for the three options to establish the funding gap in order that we can approach the Department of Transport. To date we have not received any figures and we will keep chasing.

We also contended that at a feasibility stage all options should be on the table and be included in the first stage consultation period and not just the two options that suited NR's objectives. We have written to the Secretary of State for Transport to inform him that in our opinion NR's approach to the first stage consultation period is biased and flawed and requested that he intervene to see fair play.

We all have to realise that NR 's objectives are not the same as the villages objectives. NR are looking for the cheapest solution without considering that our principle objectives are to reduce the increasing traffic flow through the village and eliminate the delays caused by the level crossing. There is no doubt in everyones mind who attended the presentations that the two NR options, the "in line route" and the "in village route" will have a detrimental effect on Tallington. The traffic will increase, speeding will increase, more pollution, more noise, more difficulties in accessing the main road from side roads and the potential for more accidents are the main objections to NR's proposals.

The "in line route" will comprise a bridge rising to a height of approx 7.5 metres above the railway tracks. The bridge will be located above the old signal box very near the existing crossing. It has been locally likened to a ski slope. It will be a steep concrete structure and severely dominate and affect the local landscape. On the east side of the railway line traffic accessing the Whistle Stop pub will have to drive under the bridge and the structure will form a viaduct. On the village side of the crossing traffic will descend a steep slope and join the original road near Searson Close and will then no doubt speed on round the bend.

The "in village route" is the same route we saw just before Christmas. We are amazed that this option is still being considered bearing in mind the reception it received when it was first disclosed in December. The route passes behind the Whistle Stop pub, crosses the railway line to the south of the existing level crossing, tracks across fields and joins Main Road near the village hall and involves demolishing at least one property plus affecting other properties.

We know that our County Councillors do not support these two options. The Parish Council do not support either of the NR options and suggest that if you feel the same way you must make your views known to our MP, our County Council and County Councillors, our District Council and District Councillors, the Secretary of State for Transport and of course Network Rail.

Our joint objective over the next month or so must be to get NR to withdraw these two totally unacceptable options and to reinstate the first stage consultation period to include all options that will benefit not only Tallington but also the surrounding areas and local economies.






